CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

Designated Location for posting of "General Notices" Civil Code § 4045 (3) (a)

A "General Notice" is a notice by the Association to the entire membership.

Effective January 1, 2014, The Association has designated the following location for the posting of "General Notices" to the membership:

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

AERIFICATION

As the spring growing season approaches, it is time to start thinking about the annual implementation of cultural practices, specifically fairway aerification.

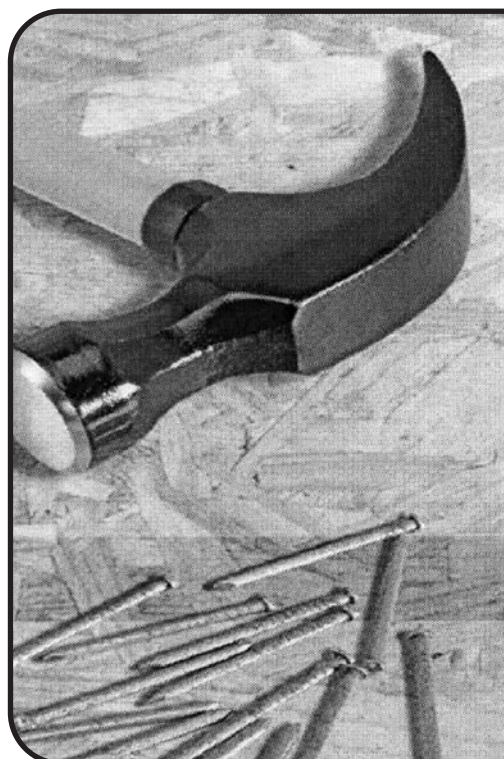
Aeration is important as it allows for management of organic matter in the soil, relieves soil compaction, stimulates root growth, releases toxic gases from the soil, improves water infiltration, improves drainage, allows for amendments to incorporate into the soil, and improves turfgrass response to fertilizers. It is usually performed during periods of growth ranging from early spring through fall.

Here at Silver Lakes Country Club, we utilize a state-of-the-art deep tine aerifier (Wiedenmann Terra Spike XF) on the fairways as part of our salt mitigation program. The Terra Spike allows us to aerify deep, at a fast speed of 3.5mph while increasing the affected area without disruption to turf conditions. By utilizing this aerifier, we are able to effectively break up compacted soil and incorporate amendments into the soil. This process allows for increased water penetration, increased pore space for roots, increased movement of water and air in the soil, and enables salts to be moved (leached) below the root zone. All of these benefit the turf health and the playing conditions at Silver Lakes Country Club while limiting the closure time.

Please bear with us as we strive to make the course the best it can be, and as always, we hope to see you out on the course!

As I stated in last year's February Ledger article this month brings some news that I am not sure everyone is aware of. Fresh off our win in 2023 we were again nominated for "The Best in the Desert" in 2024. 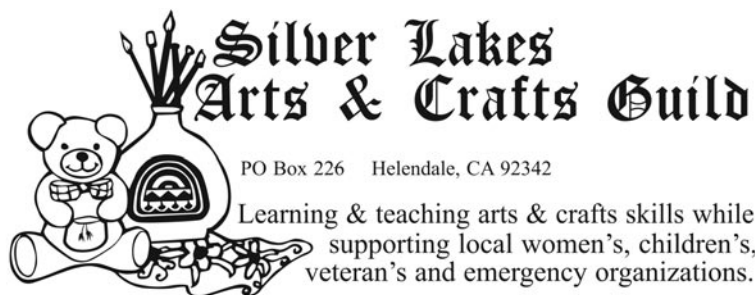

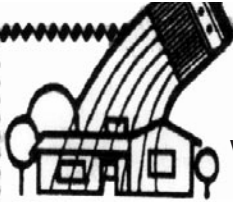

Later this month, we will restock both of our lakes with trout, offering an exciting opportunity for anglers of all skill levels. To help you make the most of this experience, here are some tips on tackle and fishing techniques to reel in these beautiful fish.

There are many effective ways to entice trout including casting or trolling lures such as Rapalas, Kastmasters, spinners or jigs, but one of the easiest methods is using a PowerBait setup.

HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Line Weight:

The lighter the line, the more convincing your bait will appear to the fish. For beginners, we recommend starting with a 6 lb test line. More experienced anglers can challenge themselves by using a 2 lb test line, which increases the number of bites but also increases the difficulty of reeling in a catch without breaking the line.

Rig Setup:

A sliding sinker rig with an 18-inch leader is the most popular setup for PowerBait fishing.

Bait and Hooks:

Every color of PowerBait can work, but garlic-flavored baits tend to perform exceptionally well in our lakes. Use a size 12-16 treble hook for a solid hook-up when trout bite, but if you're practicing catch-and-release, opt for a size 2 or 4 single hook for easier unhooking.

Catch-and-Release Tips:

If you're releasing your catch, handle the trout gently with wet hands to protect their delicate scales and slime coat.

If you decide to keep your catch, you'll be rewarded with delicious table fare! Remember, our lakes have a 5-fish limit per person for trout.

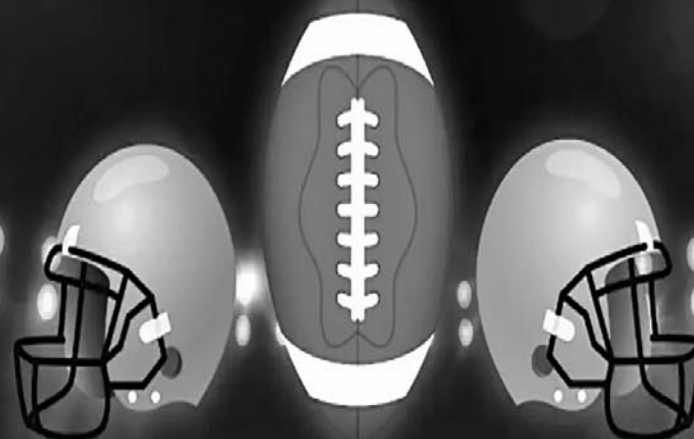

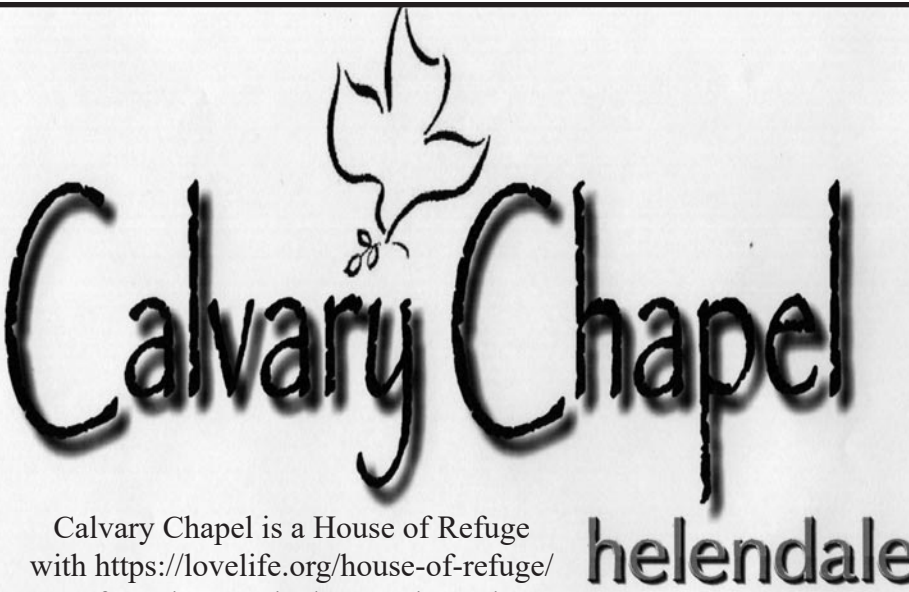
