Message from the Board

Let's talk water. Over the past two winters we have seen an increase in rain in the high desert area. This is both good and bad. The bad comes in the form of the green weeds we see in our yards and vacant lots within our development. It is all property owners' responsibility, including the Association, to properly maintain and remove these from our respective properties in

accordance with our rules. It is only a matter of time for the temperature to turn causing the weeds to take off as it is clearly beginning. Another bad area is not related to the increased rain over the past two years, but due to the lack of rain preceding this period. As stated in a previous *Ledger* article, we have been subject to an ongoing decrease in the amount of water we can remove via our wells from the river basin. Unfortunately, a judge in control of this reduced the amount by 4.9% or ap-

proximately 200 acre feet. This deficit will require purchasing water via the Mohave Water Master at a substantial rate.

As for the good, the recent rains have allowed us to pump less water from our wells to fill the lakes and irrigate the golf course. Additionally, due to the past two years of increased rain, there is a possibility of the judge giving us back the 4.9% of water as the aquifer has improved. However, this will not occur until next year at the earliest. At the last

open board meeting, it was approved to purchase "make-up" water for the previous year along with additional water to be carried over to offset this year's shortfall. We were able to purchase this water at a discounted rate saving approximately \$15,000. As a way to manage this ongoing shortfall, the Board has begun the process of developing a long term plan to reduce the amount of turf requiring irrigation on the golf course. Lastly, our new well is up and running at Hartford Park.

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

TEST PLOTS UPDATE

As our test plots of Seashore Paspalum and Bermudagrass varieties approach their first full year on 7 north fairway, we have been able to observe some of the characteristic traits of each variety and how each has reacted to the environment at Silver Lakes. This past winter was on the mild side with regards to temperatures and we received a significant amount of rain as well. This is one of the reasons the test plots will be monitored for three years. Below are some of the observed characteristics throughout year one.

Platinum TE Seashore Paspalum:

- Best color throughout establishment
- Fastest to establish
- First variety to lose color near the end of October
- Last variety to awaken from dormancy
- Struggling to fill in from dormancy (50% in mid-April)

Santa Ana Bermudagrass:

- Maintained color throughout October
- Third variety to come out of dormancy
- First variety to show vertical growth in March
- Canopy density is similar to Common Bermuda

Bandera Bermudagrass:

- Maintained color throughout October
- Second variety to awaken from dormancy in February
- Second best canopy density coming out of dormancy

Tahoma 31 Bermudagrass:

- Took the longest to establish from installation date
- Least affected by the water cutbacks in summer
- Maintained color throughout October
- Lowest/tightest height during dormancy
- First variety to awaken from dormancy in early February
- Canopy with the most density combined with the tightest lie

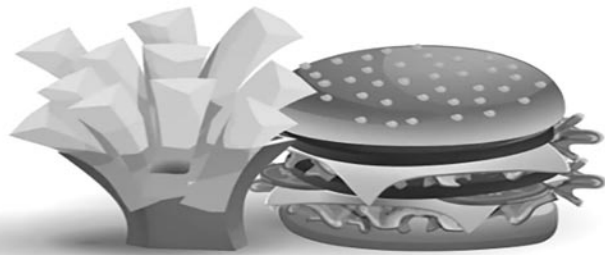

Spring weather has finally arrived!! This past winter we received some much-needed rain and the course is in really great shape. The condition of the course has a lot to do with how our golfers treat it while using it. Please make sure that you are using cart paths where available. Carts also should not be driven within 30 feet of greens as well as bunkers. Now, more than ever, it is also important that you fill your divots, rake bunkers, and fix ball marks on the greens. Please, please, please observe and obey these common rules of golf and help maintain our wonderful amenity.

Additionally, players are still required to check in a minimum of 15 minutes prior to their tee time or you may have to forfeit it. As play picks up and the course gets busier this is very important. On tournament days please be considerate of golf shop staff and other golfers by making it to the course a minimum of 30 minutes before your tee time. Give yourself some time to enjoy an item from the snack bar or roll a few putts, or even hit a warmup bucket of balls-your golf score will reflect this and your time spent on the course will be that much more enjoyable.

It is unfortunate but I need to remind everyone that range balls and baskets are the property of the as-

sociation and taking them away from the driving range is a violation of the rules and regulations. We recently replenished the range with new balls and baskets are already missing many of the balls. Please only purchase what you need to hit and leave unhit balls and baskets on the range or better yet return them to the golf shop.

As we move into the warmer weather, it is extremely important for everyone to follow the dress code. This means no blue jeans, no tee shirts, no short shorts, no spaghetti straps, no flip flops, etc... If you're not familiar with our dress code, feel free to stop in the golf shop and ask.

Finally, as a reminder, you can call the golf shop 7 days in advance for your tee times and make sure that you present your CURRENT I.D. cards upon check-in and that all guests have current cards as well. The golf course is becoming increasingly busy and we are starting to see many new faces around the shop. All association members and guests are required to present and have their cards whenever they use an amenity.

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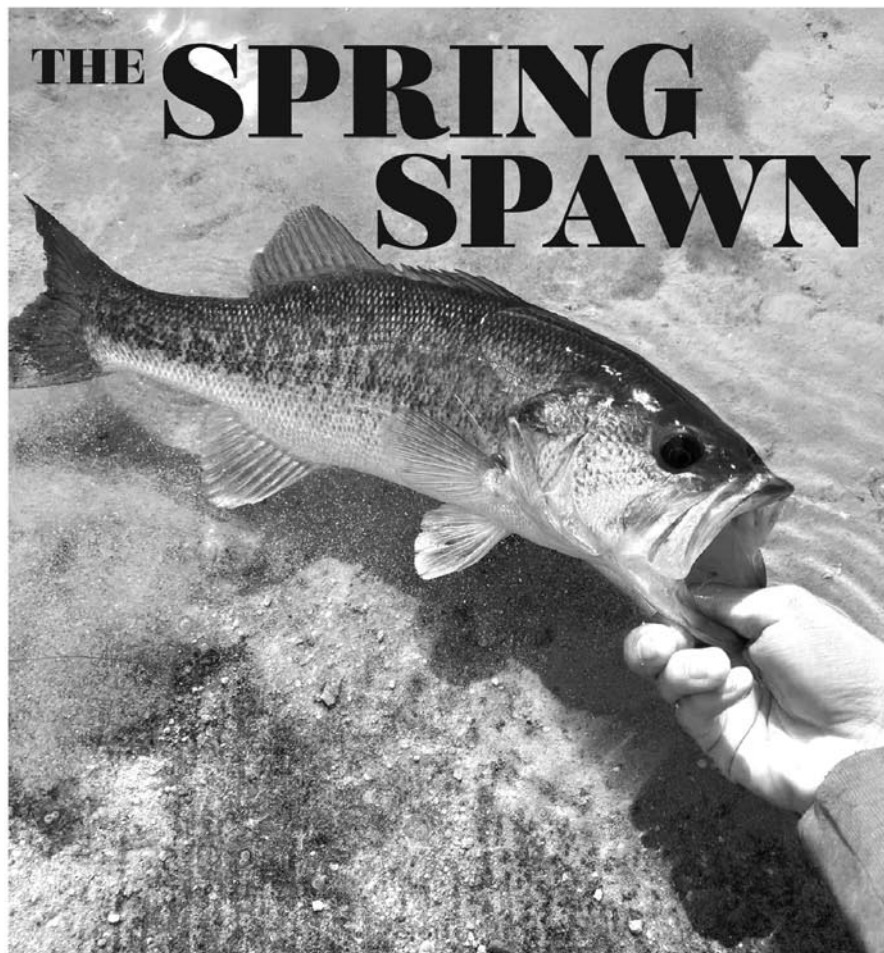

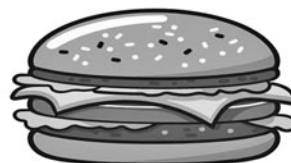

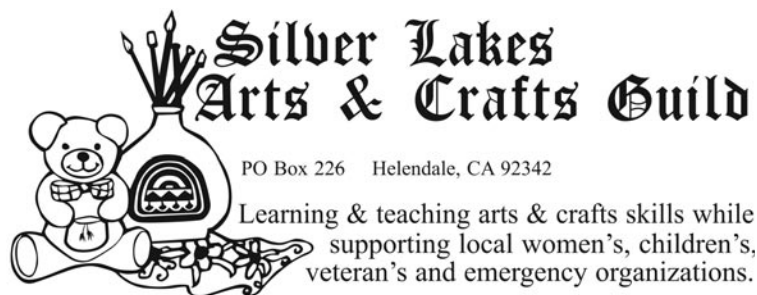

As your new president, I hope I can encourage those that are interested in doing crafts, such as ceramics,



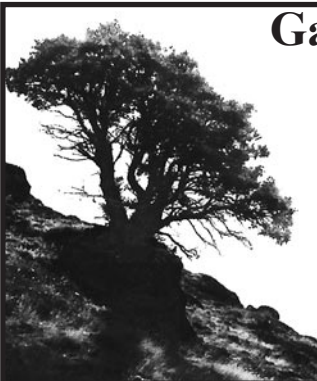

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Swimmer's itch

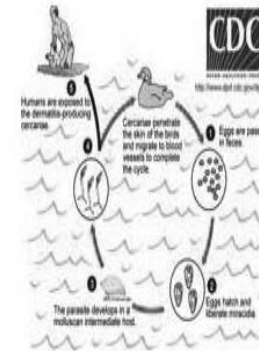
Swimmer's itch is caused by the larval stage of a group of flatworm parasites. These parasites use both freshwater snails and vertebrates, like ducks, as hosts in their parasitic life cycles.

Humans usually become infected after swimming in lakes or other bodies of slow-moving fresh water. Children may become infected more frequently and more intensely than adults but this probably reflects their tendency to swim for longer periods.

It is a short-term reaction occurring in the skin of humans that have been infected by water-borne parasite. Symptoms, which include itchy, raised papules, commonly occur within hours of infection and do not generally last more than a week. It is common in freshwater, brackish and marine habitats worldwide.

There are no permanent effects to people from this condition. An orally administered antihistamine, is sometimes prescribed to treat swimmer's itch. In addition, bathing in oatmeal, baking soda, or Epsom salts can also provide relief of symptoms.

Life-cycle of swimmers itch



Once an egg is immersed in water, a short-lived, non-feeding, free-living stage emerges. This stage uses cilia to follow chemical and physical cues thought to increase its chances of finding the first intermediate host in its life cycle, a freshwater snail.

After infecting a snail, it develops into cyst that produces another short-lived, free-living stage, the cercaria.

Cercariae use a tail-like appendage (often forked in genera causing swimmer's itch) to swim to the surface of the water, and use various physical and chemical cues in order to locate the next and final (definitive) host in the life cycle, a bird. These larvae can accidentally come into contact with the skin of a swimmer. The cercaria penetrates the skin and dies in the skin immediately. The cercariae cannot infect humans, but they cause an inflammatory immune reaction. This reaction causes initially mildly itchy spots on the skin. Within hours, these spots become raised papules which are intensely itchy. Each papule corresponds to the penetration site of a single parasite.

After locating a bird, the parasite penetrates through the skin (usually the feet), dropping the forked tail in the process. Inside the circulatory system, the immature worms develop into mature male and female worms, mate and migrate through the host's circulatory system, or nervous system, to the final location within the host body. There they lay eggs in the small veins in the intestines from which they make their way into the gut, and are dumped into the water when the bird defecates, thus completing the life cycle.

XIII. SWIMMING POOL, WADING POOL AND SPA

A. GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

1. Admission Policies:

a. Swimming pool hours vary with seasons. Current operating hours will be posted.

b. **All persons entering the pool area must present a current SLA ID or Guest Card with photo ID. (100.00)**

c. **Use of the pool when it is not open is prohibited. . (100.00)**

d. **If special accommodations are needed contact the SLA Recreation Department prior to use. . (100.00)**

e. **If using the chair lift, one must be able to do so independently. . (100.00)**

f. ~~Life guards will be on duty at the Clubhouse pool during the swim season.~~

f. Lifeguards are **SLA Staff** are vested with supervisory authority in the pool area and are accordingly charged with the responsibility of maintaining order. ~~Lifeguards-~~ **SLA Staff** are authorized to ban/eject from the area any person who, in their judgment, is contributing to the discomfort of others, or in any way interferes with the maintenance, safety, or sanitation. (\$200.00)

g. ALL accidents, unsafe conditions, or special medical concerns shall be reported to the lifeguard SLA STAFF IMMEDIATELY. (\$100.00)

h. **Pets of any kind are prohibited. . (100.00)**

i. Failure to abide by or comply with all rules posted around the pool at all times will subject pool user to removal in addition to fines or suspension of amenities use. (\$100.00)

B. SPECIFIC RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Appropriate swimming attire must be worn while swimming. Individuals not properly attired will not be permitted to enter the pools. (\$100.00)
a. **Pool users must wear swimming suits or swimming trunks upon entry to the pool. No cotton or loose fitting attire. (100.00)**
b. **Swim attire should not have been worn for exercising immediately before pool use.**
c. **Material must be colorfast, lightweight, and suitable for swimming. ie., lycra, spandex or nylon.**

2. No glass or breakable containers of any kind are permitted in the pool area. (\$100.00)

3. **Possessing food or beverages on the pool deck within 5 feet of the pool's edge is prohibited (except non-glass containers of water brought by user for personal consumption). (100.00)**

4. **Alcoholic beverages, and drugs are not permitted. (100.00)**

5. **Smoking (tobacco or electronic) is not permitted. (100.00)**

6. **Groups (5 or more) shall not monopolize an area of the pool and/or spa and thereby limit its use. (100.00)**

7. **Furniture is not permitted within 6 feet of the pool side. (100.00)**

8. **Silver Lakes Association is not responsible for personal property or valuables at any time.**

9. **Anyone wearing a life jacket must be within arm's reach of a responsible adult and in the shallow end. (100.00)**

10. **Headphones must be worn when listening to entertainment devices. (100.00)**

11. **Pools will be cleared for the safety breaks. Safety breaks are determined by SLA Staff. (100.00)**

12. For health and safety purposes persons under fourteen (14) years of age are not permitted in the pool area unless accompanied by a resident adult or unless they are attending a special event scheduled for such minor children where supervision is provided. (\$100.00)

13. **No diving.** Flips or other diving stunts off any side of the pool are not permitted. Running, roughhousing or excessive splashing is not permitted. **Running, boisterous or rough play, dunking wrestling, excessive splashing, yelling or any other improper conduct causing undue disturbances or any acts which would endanger any patron are prohibited.(\$100.00)**

~~14.No diving is allowed.(\$100.00)~~

~~15.Pets of any kind are prohibited in the pool area.(\$50.00)~~

14. Only those items of equipment or other apparatus approved by the General Manager and/or the Recreation Director will be permitted in the pool area. (\$50.00)

a. Only Coast Guard approved life jackets, floatation bathing suits or ring suits are permitted in or around the pool areas. (\$50.00)

b. Any toys brought to the pool area must be approved by the pool monitor prior to use. (\$50.00)

c. **Educational toys such as diving rings can be used at the surface and below.**

d. **Balls, noodles, innertubes, rafts or any inflatable is not permitted. (\$50.00)**

e. **Scuba masks, goggles with nose piece, and snorkels are not permitted. (\$50.00)**

f. **Specialized equipment not limited to noodles, kickboards, fins, paddles, scuba masks and snorkels are to be used during educational programs and lap swim time only.**

~~15.For health and safety purposes, children under five (5) years of age are not permitted in the spa under any circumstances. Children between 5 and 14 years must be accompanied by a resident adult.(\$100.00)~~

15. Persons having active diarrhea symptoms or who have had active diarrhea within the previous fourteen (14) days shall not be allowed to enter the pool water (New CA Code of Regulations Title 24). (200.00)

16. Due to the strenuous nature of some activities, the participant is advised to consult with their physician concerning their fitness to participate.

17. Incontinent persons, including infants, using the swimming pool must wear a protective or plastic liner that will prevent the contamination of the pool water. (\$200.00)

18. Parents, legal guardians or responsible adults are required to remain in the immediate area surrounding the wading pool. This area is deemed everything inside the wading pool gated area. (\$100.00)

19. Pools will be closed due to thunder or lightning within a 10-mile radius. Pools may reopen 30 minutes after the incident.

20. Pools can be closed at any time due to inclement weather including rain, winds, and low air quality. Time of re-opening will be determined by SLA Staff.

21. Socializing with or distracting SLA pool staff is prohibited. (100.00)

22. No person shall behave in a manner as to jeopardize the safety and health of another. Such behavior, including abusive or profane language will lead to ejection, loss of amenity privilege and citation. (100.00)

23. Spa

a. **No more than 12 people within the gated area.**

b. **People should not remain in spa more than 20 minutes per hour. (50.00)**

c. **For health and safety purposes, children under five (5) years of age are not permitted in the spa under any circumstances. Children between 5 and 14 years must be accompanied by a resident adult. (\$50.00)**

24. Practice Healthy Swimming Habits

a. **Use the restroom before getting into the pool.**

b. **Shower before entering the pool. After swimming is recommended too.**

c. **Change diapers at the changing stations located in restrooms.**

d. **Avoid swallowing pool water or even getting in your mouth.**

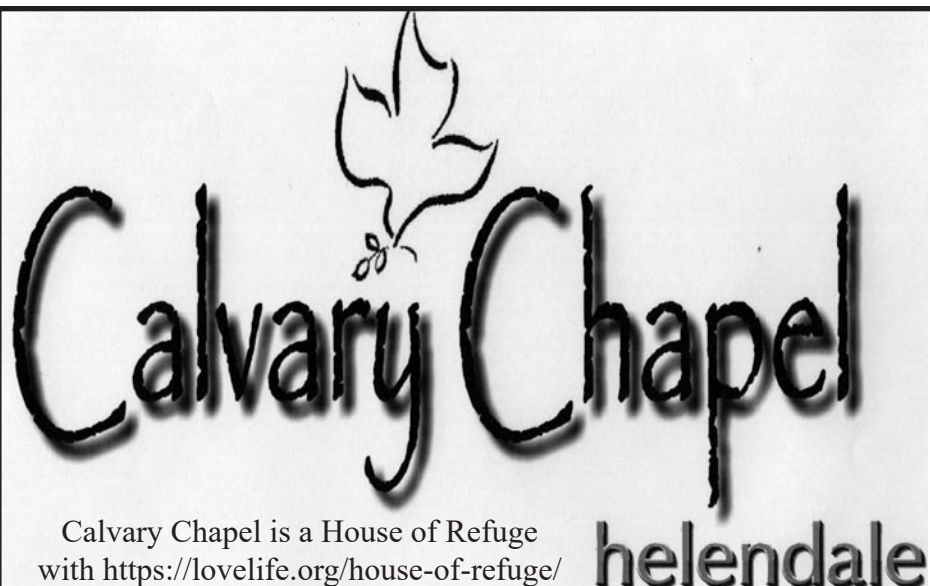
