Message from the Board

Every month the Board shares with membership the events and project status of all the efforts being made on your behalf. As members of the Association, you have asked the Board of Directors to evaluate needs and act in

your behalf. Here is an update on just a few of the projects underway.

July 6 – FIREWORKS – Over the past couple of years our members have felt that our fireworks vendor has under per-

formed. The Board, through our General Manager, met with their management and stressed the importance of their improvement. **They heard our message.**

July 6th was an outstanding fireworks display – just what we all asked for.

The Environmental Control Committee, over the past many months, has undertaken the revision and updating of the Architectural Guidelines. This is our primary tool for the development of standards for the design and upkeep of our Silver Lakes properties. The Committee labored for many months consolidating the contents and adding important new standards where needed.

The project is now in the final stages. The next step the manual goes to our legal staff for review and then to the Association members for a 28 day review, then a comment phase before finally being approved by the Board of Directors.

The **Restaurant Committee** has been reactivated and began meeting with the goal of enhancing service to and use by the membership. Survey forms will be circulated to members. Use them to expressing your ideas and concerns. Be sure to take a few minutes to let them know where improvements can be made.

The Golf Course is being studied for a major

improvement. Water use is the area of primary concern. A committee of Board members and members of the Association are examining the water and design features based on current and future needs. They then will consult with professionals. This multiyear effort will be reported to the Association members as improvements are planned.

These and many other tasks are the duties of your Board of Directors. The Board needs and encourages your input on all areas of life in Silver Lakes

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

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Aerification and Overseed

With summer in full swing, it is time to start preparing for our summer aerification. Aerification achieves three important objectives. It relieves soil compaction, provides a way to improve the soil mixture in the root zone, and helps manage thatch.

Over time, the traffic from play compacts the soil which causes us to lose the air pockets the turf roots rely on for growth. This crushing of the air pockets, if left alone, will lead to unhealthy turf. By pulling cores during aerification, we are creating more air space in the soil as well as promoting deeper rooting which leads to healthy turf.

The addition of sand topdressing along with soil amendments extends porosity and drainage by enabling the incorporation of new soil material into the root zone. It also aids in resisting compaction, both of which are essential in the "push-up" style of greens at Silver Lakes.

Some thatch, which is an accumulation of dead stems, leaves, and roots, is necessary for a healthy green however excess thatch leaves the turf susceptible to disease and insects. Sand topdressing also helps reduce thatch accumulation. Topdressing combined with aerification is one of the most effective ways to reduce existing thatch while preventing excess thatch from developing.

While many golfers dread the idea of having their greens aerified, it is a short-term disruption that has long term benefits for the golf course so remember without those little holes the greens would eventually deteriorate.

With the club taking a scheduled year off from a full overseeding, we will perform the greens aerification as well as the Tee and Approach overseeding during the four day closure in September.

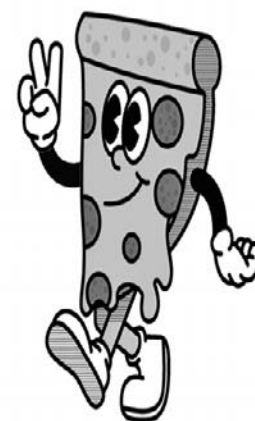

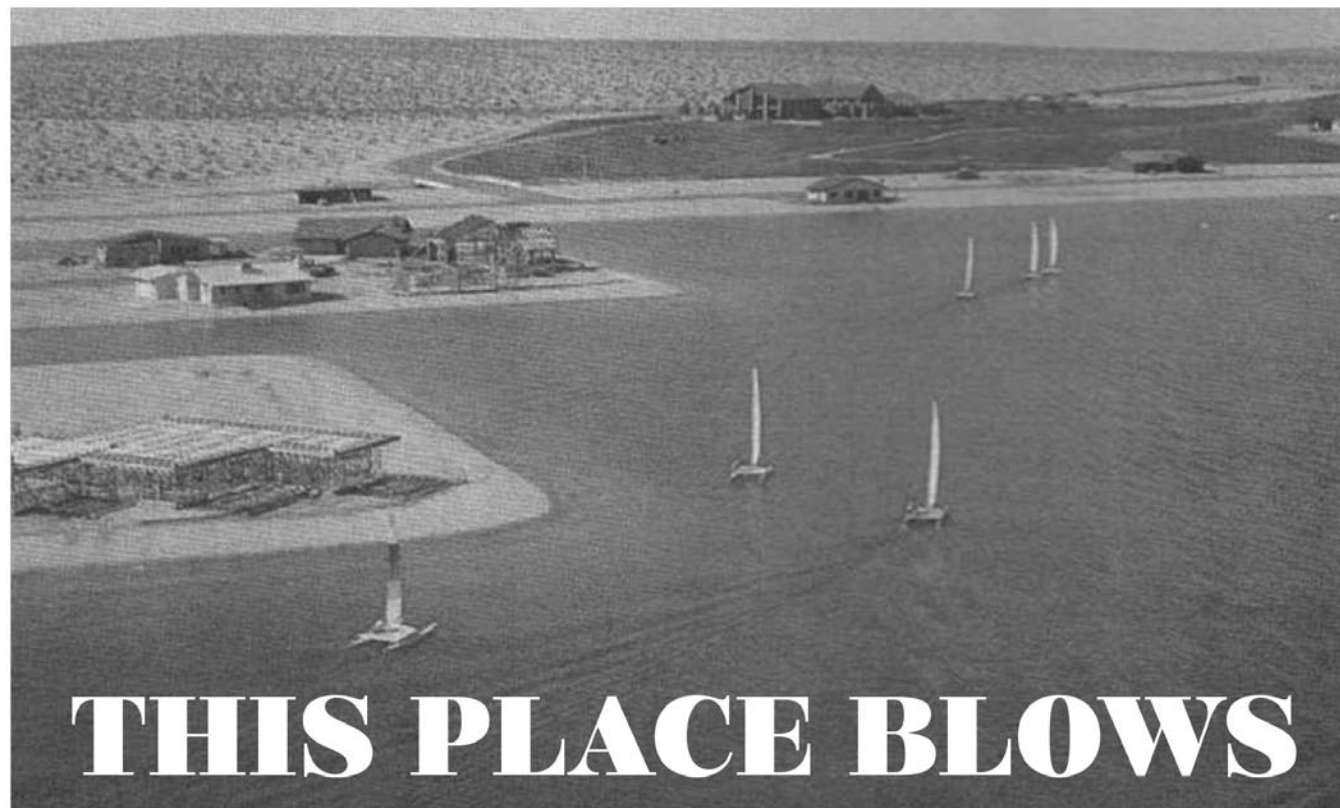

With over 300 days a year of “rideable” wind, which blows like clockwork most afternoons, Silver Lakes offers a 277-acre playground for wind sport enthusiasts. Recognizing the potential of these natural conditions, the developers designed the lakes to maximize the enjoyment of lake-goers.

The photo above captures a catamaran race on North Lake before many of the houses were built. You can spot the clubhouse atop the hill in the distance. Scenes like this were once a common sight on our lakes. However, in recent years, wind sport traffic has diminished, and only a few residents take advantage of this remarkable resource in our backyard.

Many new wind sports have emerged in recent years. Hydrofoil technology has been embraced

to allow riders to glide over choppy waters and achieve a flight-like sensation that is both exhilarating and addicting. While wind surfing has been around for decades, the addition of the foil beneath the boards have brought new excitement to the sport. Wing foiling is a newer sport that utilizes an inflateable, handheld wing used to harness the wind’s power and guide the direction of the rider.

We hope this post inspires our residents to explore and embrace the various wind sports that our lakes are perfect for. What better way to escape the heat than by enjoying the wind and water?

From the Director of Golf

There are just a couple of topics for this month. First and foremost is the maintenance of our golf course amenity. I would just like to remind everyone that we are all responsible for keeping our golf course in the best condition possible. As of this writing we have experienced an Excessive Heat warning for the last week. We have an aging irrigation system that is pushing our course maintenance staff to its limits trying to eliminate and minimize dry or hot spots. With all the cart traffic we have, our drought conditions, and restrictions we have on water it is important that we all take the time to do the things that are necessary to keep things looking their best. Most importantly is that we all keep carts on cart paths whenever possible and especially around the greens and tees. I am constantly seeing and having to talk to people taking shortcuts especially around the greens. Carts MUST stay 30 feet away from all greens and tees and bunkers. If you are worried about your seat getting hot in the sun (I realize that it doesn't take long for a cart seat to heat up while in the sun) simply use a towel and lay it down just as you would in a car during

a hot summer.

The second thing I would like to mention is checking in for tee times. Our rules and regulations are very clear and state that "Players must check in at the Pro Shop at least fifteen (15) minutes prior to their starting time in order to secure their starting time" and "Tournament players must check in at least thirty (30) minutes prior to their starting time." To facilitate getting everyone getting out on time we are requesting that when we have shotgun starting times that players check in a minimum of thirty (30) minutes prior to start on a regular day and at least 45 minutes prior to starting on tournament days. It is important if you are playing golf that you try and observe these rules. Early tee times are a premium right now and failing to do this may result in the forfeiture of your starting time. All we are asking for is a little consideration and observance of the rules and regulations. It will make for a more enjoyable start to your time spent at the golf course and it will allow staff to provide the best service possible.

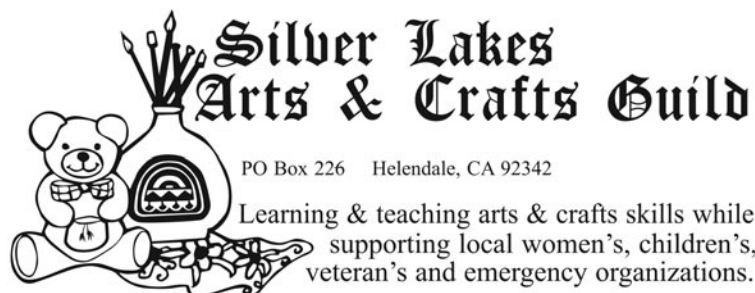

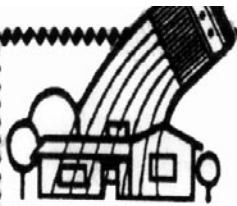

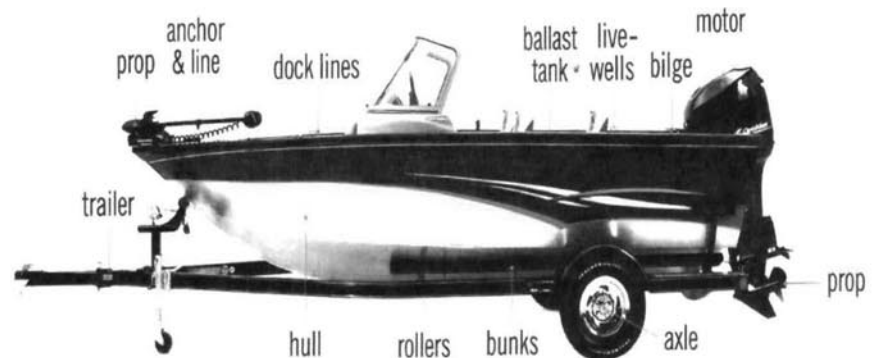

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Swimmer's itch

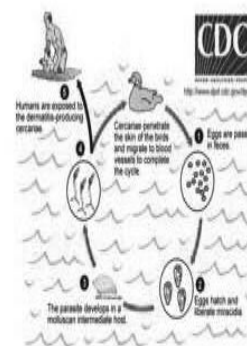
Swimmer's itch is caused by the larval stage of a group of flatworm parasites. These parasites use both freshwater snails and vertebrates, like ducks, as hosts in their parasitic life cycles.

Humans usually become infected after swimming in lakes or other bodies of slow-moving fresh water. Children may become infected more frequently and more intensely than adults but this probably reflects their tendency to swim for longer periods.

It is a short-term reaction occurring in the skin of humans that have been infected by water-borne parasite. Symptoms, which include itchy, raised papules, commonly occur within hours of infection and do not generally last more than a week. It is common in freshwater, brackish and marine habitats worldwide.

There are no permanent effects to people from this condition. An orally administered antihistamine, is sometimes prescribed to treat swimmer's itch. In addition, bathing in oatmeal, baking soda, or Epsom salts can also provide relief of symptoms.

Life-cycle of swimmers itch



Once an egg is immersed in water, a short-lived, non-feeding, free-living stage emerges. This stage uses cilia to follow chemical and physical cues thought to increase its chances of finding the first intermediate host in its life cycle, a freshwater snail.

After infecting a snail, it develops into a cyst that produces another short-lived, free-living stage, the cercaria.

Cercariae use a tail-like appendage (often forked in genera causing swimmer's itch) to swim to the surface of the water, and use various physical and chemical cues in order to locate the next and final (definitive) host in the life cycle, a bird. These larvae can accidentally come into contact with the skin of a swimmer. The cercaria penetrates the skin and dies in the skin immediately. The cercariae cannot infect humans, but they cause an inflammatory immune reaction. This reaction causes initially mildly itchy spots on the skin. Within hours, these spots become raised papules which are intensely itchy. Each papule corresponds to the penetration site of a single parasite.

After locating a bird, the parasite penetrates through the skin (usually the feet), dropping the forked tail in the process. Inside the circulatory system, the immature worms develop into mature male and female worms, mate and migrate through the host's circulatory system, or nervous system, to the final location within the host body. There they lay eggs in the small veins in the intestines from which they make their way into the gut, and are dumped into the water when the bird defecates, thus completing the life cycle.

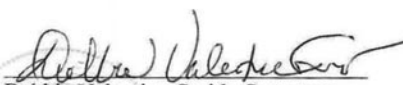

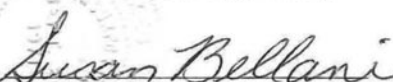

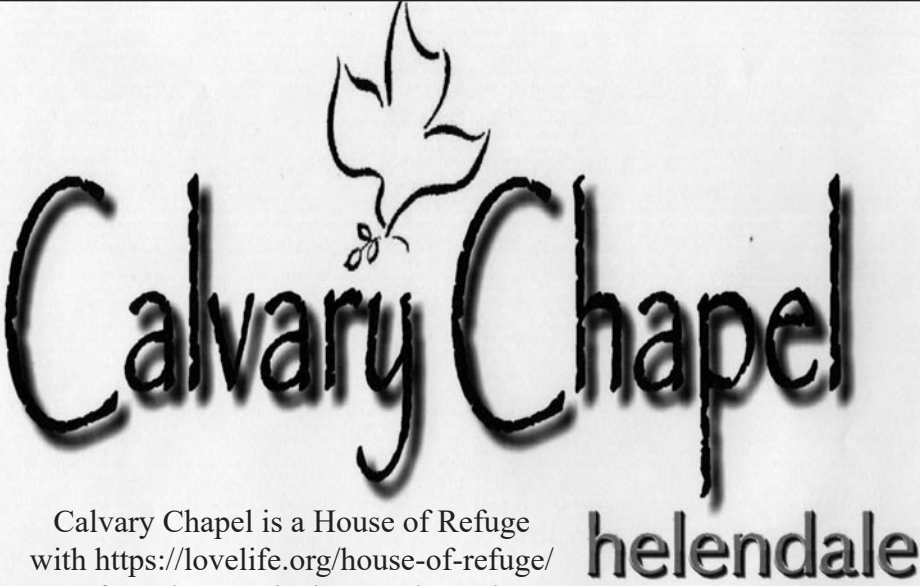
