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Message from the Board

For the past year, the Environment Control Committee (ECC), has been in the process of updating the Architectural Guidelines. They are in the final stages of what has been a thor-

ough overhaul of the guidelines in its entirety.

The committee itself is comprised of SLA compliance employees, board liaisons, and qualified members (home-

owner) of the Silver Lakes community.

The purpose of the SLA ECC is to administer the community's orderly growth and development for the protection and benefit of all property owners. The ECC is charged with enforcing the rules set forth in our C&R's section 7b. The section basically states the right of an owner to construct, reconstruct, refinish, or otherwise alter any exterior improvement on their lot is prohibited without first obtaining approval from the ECC. This includes painting, fences, sheds,

landscape, or any other change that alters the exterior of the structure or property visible from the common area or any other lot.

The ECC believe it is their duty to work with the members of the community to ensure Silver Lakes remains a wonderful place to live.

The compliance department WELCOMES questions and are a simple phone call away. They can be reached at (760)243-1569.

So if you receive a letter saying something needs to be corrected just give

them a call. It is better to get a full correct answer to what needs to be done rather than an incorrect answer to a Facebook post. There are financial repercussions if a homeowner fails to respond or correct a violation. So your first step is to call ECC (760) 243-1569. Where our wonderful staff are more than happy to help you! You can also get your own copy of the Architectural Guidelines at the Silver Lakes Association office.

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

Greens Aerification and Tee/Collar Overseed

With fall right around the corner, it is time for our late season green's aerification and this year a partial overseed. The greens will receive a regular core aerification. Overseed will be minimal this year consisting of tees, collars, and approaches. Fairways and roughs adjacent to the greens and fairways will not be overseeded however we may add seed through slit seeding to thin areas.

During a normal fall and a normal overseed, the golf course would be closed for 28 days in order to complete the aerification, overseed, and grow-in prior to re-opening for play. This year, the golf course will only be closed for 4 days September (9th – 12th) when we will be completing the greens aerification and prepping and seeding the areas designated for overseed.

With the shortened closure period, there will be the benefit of playing golf during the month of September, but there will be several significant changes to your round of golf. First and foremost, with no closure we will be forced to water the new seed during the daytime which means there will be sprinklers on throughout your round. This will cause the areas around the greens to be wetter than normal as well.

Tees will be irrigated during the daytime as well but will have the benefit of temporary tees to play from. As we have done in the past, there will be a temporary tee for the blue and gold tees and there will be one for the white and red tees.

In addition to the tees, collars (fringes) and approaches to the greens, we will be seeding small areas in the fairways that weaken during the heat. It is best to deter all cart traffic through newly seeded areas. To direct this traffic around these small areas, you may see directional signs or ropes and stakes to protect these areas until they are established. Please be patient during this period of time as we do everything possible to prepare for the winter season.

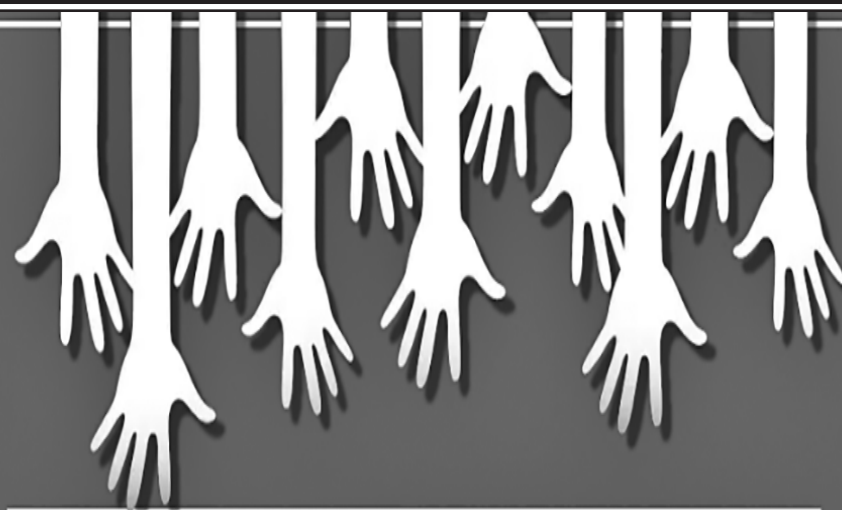

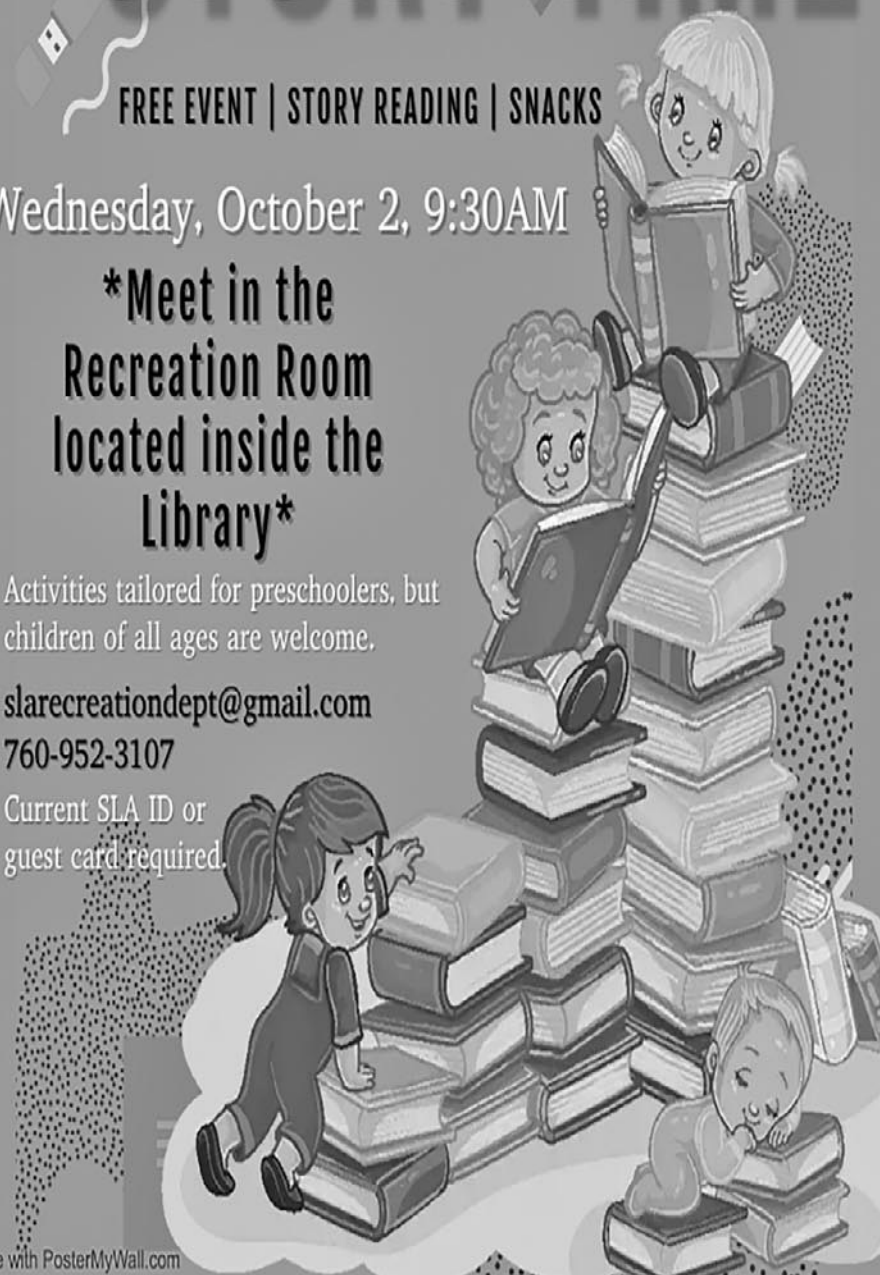

After reassignment to Fort Irwin in 2003 Dave learned

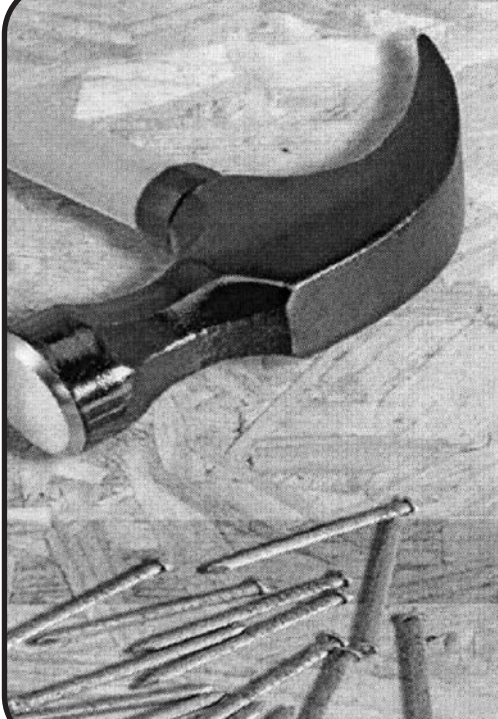

One of the best ways to cool off in Silver Lakes is to hit the water by boat on either of our beautiful lakes. We hope everyone has a chance to cruise our lakes to fish, swim, or simply catch a sunset. As you get out on the water, we'd like to offer this friendly reminder: Look behind you periodically as you navigate near the perimeter of the lakes or close to other boats, swimmers, kayakers, and paddleboarders. At moderate speeds, a boat can create a significant wake, which can cause damage and dangerous situations for others in the water. Folks in V-hull style boats should be particularly mindful, as these types of boats create a much bigger wake even at slow speeds. Repeated strong wakes can damage boats docked on the open water and contribute to the erosion of the lake liner.

As a reminder, here are some guidelines to follow:

Speed Limit: The speed limit on the lake is 10 mph.

Slow Zones: No wakes are allowed in the fingers and close to swimming areas.

Distance from Shore: When operating at higher speeds, maintain a safe distance from the shore and docks to minimize the impact of your wake.

Wake Courtesy: If you see kayakers, swimmers, or areas where people are fishing, slow down to reduce your wake and ensure their safety.

Let's make the most of the summer and enjoy our oasis with courtesy and safety.

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Swimmer's itch

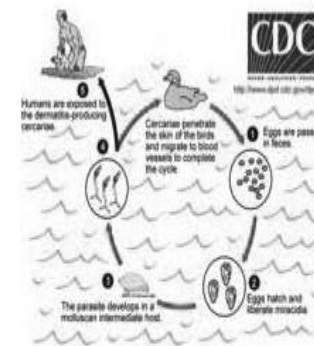
Swimmer's itch is caused by the larval stage of a group of flatworm parasites. These parasites use both freshwater snails and vertebrates, like ducks, as hosts in their parasitic life cycles.

Humans usually become infected after swimming in lakes or other bodies of slow-moving fresh water. Children may become infected more frequently and more intensely than adults but this probably reflects their tendency to swim for longer periods.

It is a short-term reaction occurring in the skin of humans that have been infected by water-borne parasite. Symptoms, which include itchy, raised papules, commonly occur within hours of infection and do not generally last more than a week. It is common in freshwater, brackish and marine habitats worldwide.

There are no permanent effects to people from this condition. An orally administered antihistamine, is sometimes prescribed to treat swimmer's itch. In addition, bathing in oatmeal, baking soda, or Epsom salts can also provide relief of symptoms.

Life-cycle of swimmers itch



Once an egg is immersed in water, a short-lived, non-feeding, free-living stage emerges. This stage uses cilia to follow chemical and physical cues thought to increase its chances of finding the first intermediate host in its life cycle, a freshwater snail.

After infecting a snail, it develops into cyst that produces another short-lived, free-living stage, the cercaria.

Cercariae use a tail-like appendage (often forked in genera causing swimmer's itch) to swim to the surface of the water; and use various physical and chemical cues in order to locate the next and final (definitive) host in the life cycle, a bird. These larvae can accidentally come into contact with the skin of a swimmer. The cercaria penetrates the skin and dies in the skin immediately. The cercariae cannot infect humans, but they cause an inflammatory immune reaction. This reaction causes initially mildly itchy spots on the skin. Within hours, these spots become raised papules which are intensely itchy. Each papule corresponds to the penetration site of a single parasite.

After locating a bird, the parasite penetrates through the skin (usually the feet), dropping the forked tail in the process. Inside the circulatory system, the immature worms develop into mature male and female worms, mate and migrate through the host's circulatory system, or nervous system, to the final location within the host body. There they lay eggs in the small veins in the intestines from which they make their way into the gut, and are dumped into the water when the bird defecates, thus completing the life cycle.

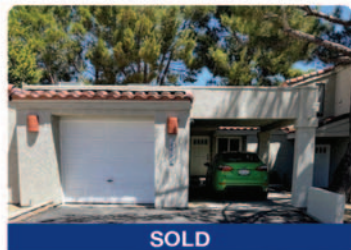
