

The Association received good news from the County today! Effective tomorrow Thursday April 23, 2020 the Association Members will be allowed to access and play the golf course again. Several county courses will be opening this weekend but because we already had a plan in place the County is allowing us to let you back on the course tomorrow with restrictions. IT IS MORE IMPORTANT THAN EVER that our membership take it upon themselves to make sure that the guidelines are being followed. The Counties are under heavy scrutiny for allowing golf courses to open and will be monitoring our daily activities heavily to ensure that their requirements are being met. As things change over the upcoming days and weeks, we will do our best to promptly update you as to the requirements as we move towards getting more parts of the facility open.

Code Enforcement will be monitoring for the following:

-On any SLA amenity, San Bernardino County order for face coverings. Face coverings may include coverings that secure to the ears or back of the head and encompass the mouth and nose. Homemade cloth ear loop covers, bandannas and handkerchiefs and neck gaiters may be used.

-Social distancing requirements of at least 6 feet must be met.

-The golf course will be available starting at 8:00 a.m. We respectfully ask that you DO NOT pile up and gather on the 1st tee boxes. Maintain appropriate physical distancing.

-Random Checks for all authorized SLA Id cards. The only golfers with access to the golf course are Members. **GUESTS ARE NOT ALLOWED.** If proper ID is not shown to Code Enforcement, then that player will be required to leave the golf course.

-Making sure groups are following the maximum number of player guidelines which is **no more than 5 people in a group.** NO EXCEPTIONS.

-Not allowing gatherings around the golf shop, putting green, and driving range area after play. Once you are done with your round, vacate the premises immediately.

-Restroom must be locked and urinating on the golf course will result in a fine.

-One person to a golf cart unless they are members living in the same household. "Same household" means that the numbers on the ID cards match.

Recommendations when on the golf course:

-Leave the flagstick in while on the putting greens in order to eliminate excessive contact.

-Avoid shaking hands at the completion of your round of golf.

- Practice physical distancing on tee boxes and greens.
