CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

A "General Notice" is a notice by the Association to the entire membership.

Effective January 1, 2014, The Association has designated the following location for the posting of "General Notices" to the membership:

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

Winter Projects Update

Oftentimes, we are asked... "What do you do during the winter while the grass isn't growing as much?" This is a very valid question because some of what we accomplish during the cooler months isn't flashy or as noticeable. However, the tasks are very important in the overall management of the course at all times of the year. This winter we have been collaborating with the irrigation ADHOC committee to finalize the new turf lines for the potential irrigation renovations. Many of you have seen the small flags throughout the course this past January and February which are utilized to indicate where the potential new turf edges will be based on the approved reduction design. Once the perimeter was confirmed with the ADHOC committee, nails with plastic feathers were installed followed by GPS recording by David with Fairway Design. These perimeters will be utilized to complete the new irrigation design.

Throughout the year we have worked on the turf reduction around the tee complexes of 7 South. This has been a slow process as we are utilizing in house labor when we are able to redirect. The turf conversion on 7 South is complete with regards to the drip irrigation and new plantings, however the hardscape materials are approximately 60% complete. Four additional truck loads of DG were ordered during the week of February 10. Once this tee complex is completed, it will serve as a good template for the tee complexes throughout the property.

This past winter we also spent significant time performing an annual cleanup and refresh of the already converted areas. This work included mechanical and chemical removal of weeds, edging turf and DG borders, trimming trees and bushes and reburying any irrigation lines that have been exposed over the past year. This is a routine process performed every winter allowing us to be ready for the spring growing season.

As always, we look forward to seeing you out on the course!

From the Director of Golf

As the weather finally begins to warm up it's time for everyone to start thinking about getting out and enjoying the golf course. One event that has really become popular is our monthly couples event held on the last Thursday of every month. Our March event is scheduled for March 27th at 2pm. Sign up in the golf shop and come out and enjoy an afternoon of golf followed by a light meal in the restaurant.

The cost is \$20 per couple which includes the light meal in the restaurant immediately following play. Come out and enjoy a Spring afternoon with a great group of people.

Unfortunately, I need to spend some time in this article on a couple of items that everyone should be well aware of yet are not getting addressed daily with our members who are enjoying the golf course amenity. The first item is the care of the bunkers. During Covid it was considered acceptable to not rake bunkers since the bunker rakes were not being utilized. Folks we are no longer under Covid restrictions and it is unacceptable for anyone to play a shot from a bunker and not take

the time to rake it smooth with the rakes that are provided for this purpose. The second item we need to talk about is repairing ball marks on the green. Yes, this can be a bit of a challenge when it is cold out and the greens are firm. However, as temperatures warm up many of us seem to forget that this is an extremely necessary task for us all to make sure we do. It takes less than 5 seconds for a ball mark to be repaired. It takes at least 5 weeks though for a ball mark to heal that is not repaired. These marks can develop into areas that are susceptible to disease and ultimately bare spots that may require us to resod which is time consuming and completely unnecessary if we just take the time to repair the damage made by a ball landing on the green. Additionally, it is always a good idea to repair your ball mark as well as one more. As we move into Spring this practice becomes very important. Please take the time to repair ball marks on our greens and help us to keep the course in the best condition possible.

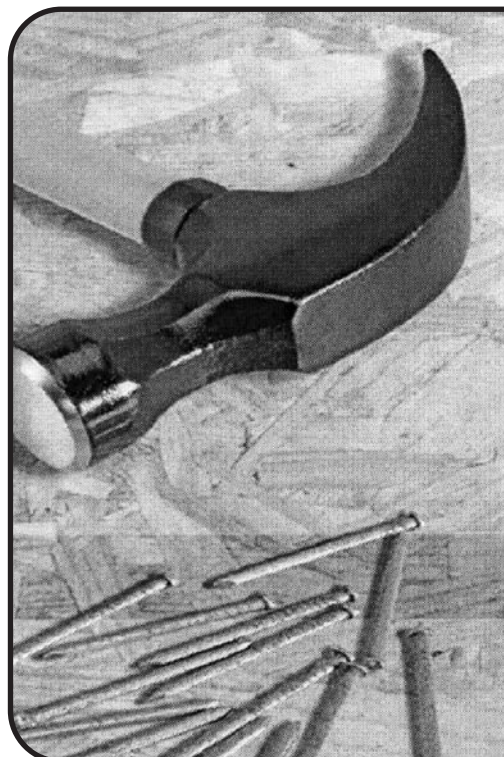

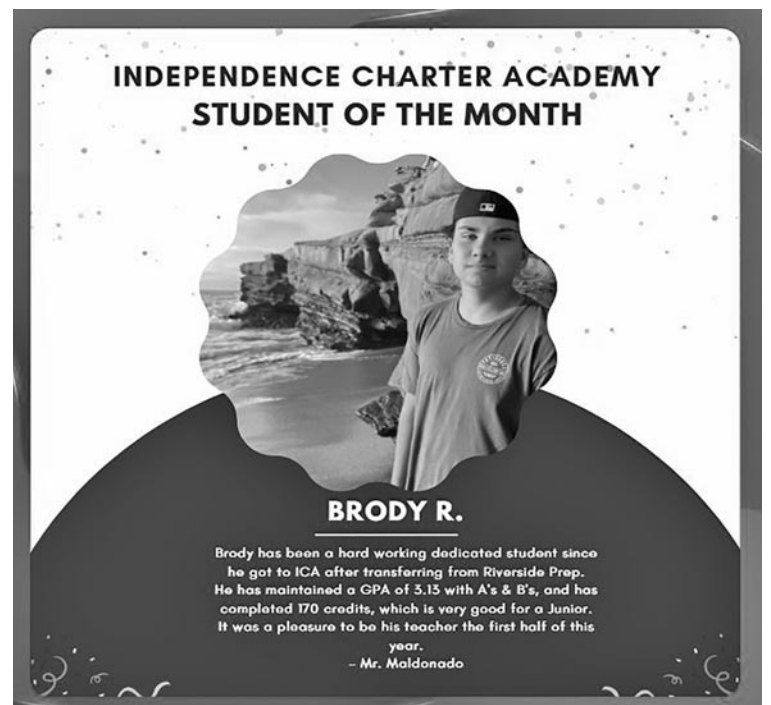

Redear sunfish, in particular, are vital for controlling the snail population in the lakes. Snails are part of the life cycle of swimmer's itch, a condition no one enjoys. By allowing the re-dear sunfish population to thrive, we naturally reduce the occurrences of swimmer's itch and maintain a healthier aquatic environment.

Support Our Code Enforcement and Conservation Efforts

Our code enforcement personnel play a key role in ensuring that the lakes are enjoyed responsibly and exclusively by residents and their guests. They check IDs and monitor activity to protect this community resource. When you see them on duty, un-

derstand that they are doing important work to keep our lakes secure and enjoyable for all of us.

Trout stocking is another significant investment that benefits the community. Each year, resources are dedicated to maintaining a healthy trout population for recreational fishing. While the daily limit may allow for taking up to five trout, practicing conservation is encouraged. If you aren't going to eat the fish, consider releasing them so others can enjoy catching them in the future.
