Message from the Board

The Board of Directors is pleased to provide you with an update on two important matters currently underway within our community.

Barn Replacement Project

At the inception of our Association, a barn was built that has served our community for many years. Re-

cently, the Board investigated the cost of maintaining this structure, and the estimated expense was approximately \$350,000. After a thorough review by multiple Board members, we identified a cost-effective solution—a manufactured barn designed for installation to replace the existing barn.

Through the dedicated efforts of Board members, the original barn has been removed at no cost to the Association. This achievement reflects our commitment to fiscal responsibility and preserving our community's resources. We will continue to keep you informed as this project progresses.

Upcoming Budget Preparation & Financial Review

The Board has been diligently working on the upcoming budget for the Association. As part of this process, the Financial Review Committee has initiated an audit of our water and electricity billing to ensure accuracy and identify potential savings. Additionally, we have reviewed under-budgeted line items to optimize our financial planning.

To further reduce costs and improve efficiency, we have begun implementing an

electronic communication system for homeowners and the management team. This initiative will help minimize printing and mailing expenses while ensuring faster and more convenient updates to our membership. We encourage all homeowners to provide their email addresses to the management office to stay informed about Association matters.

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

THE SPRING SPAWN

The coots have finally moved on, leaving us with crystal-clear waters again. In the coming weeks, the largemouth bass will begin their spawning season. Bass are currently feeding aggressively in preparation for the extended spawning period, providing some of the best bass fishing of the year. The spawning beds can be identified by dish-shaped clearings in shallow areas, usually around docks.

Your Lakes Advisory Committee, along with the help of the association and volunteers, will be stocking the lakes

with much-needed feeder fish in the coming weeks. These feeder fish will predominantly consist of bluegill sunfish. While bluegills provide fun fishing for all, the goal is to have them reproduce, creating a renewable supply of prey for our trophy bass.

Fishing Tips

Use Soft Plastics and Jigs: Lures like soft plastic worms, lizards, and jigs work well near spawning beds. Slowly dragging them along the bottom can provoke strikes from protective bass.

Search for beds: Bass spawn in shallow areas. Since our lakes are shal-

low throughout, look for bass near docks, cattails and weed beds and also near the various submerged structures we have in the lakes.

Use Polarized Sunglasses: These help cut glare and allow you to

spot bass guarding their nests more easily.

Fish Early and Late: Bass tend to be more active in the early morning and late afternoon when the water is cooler and less disturbed.

Catch and Release Guidelines

Spawning bass are particularly vulnerable during this time, as they are focused on protecting their nests. Repeatedly catching and releasing

the same fish can cause excessive stress and leave their nests unguarded, making them susceptible to predators. Try to minimize time spent fighting and handling these fish to ensure their survival and successful reproduction.

Remember, our bass are catch-and-release only. Avoid over-pressuring spawning bass to help maintain a healthy population. Be gentle when handling them. Placing a thumb in the mouth of the bass and gripping the lower jaw will help subdue the fish while removing the hook and taking your photo. Avoid handling the body of the fish with dry hands or rags, as this can damage the vital slime layer, potentially leading to illness or mortality.

Get out there, have fun, and enjoy these amazing lakes!

The weather is finally starting to warm up and the golf course is showing signs of spring conditions. The upcoming Spring and Summer schedule have many events scheduled and we hope to see lots of players signing up and participating.

As we move into the warm weather, we want to remind everyone that the dress code for the golf course will be strictly enforced.

MEN

(1)Shirts must have collars and sleeves. Turtlenecks and mock turtleneck shirts must have a minimum of ¾" collar. Tank tops and T-shirts are prohibited.

(2)Blue denim jeans, or shorts are prohibited.

(3)Shorts must have at least a fourteen (14) inch out-seam not including waistband or no more than six (6) inches above or below the knee. Swim trunks, jogging shorts, bike shorts, tennis shorts, baggy shorts below the knee and cut-offs are prohibited.

(4)Shoes with metal spikes, big knobby sole shoes, flip-flops, and any similar type shoes are prohibited.

WOMEN

(1)Shirts must be tailored for golf. Turtlenecks and mock turtleneck shirts must have a minimum of ¾" collar. Tank tops and T-shirts are prohibited.

(2)Blue denim jeans or shorts are prohibited.

(3)Halter-tops, tops with spaghetti straps, and/or bare midriff tops, and swimsuit tops are prohibited.

(4)Shorts must have at least a fourteen (14) inch out-seam not including waistband or no more than six (6) inches above or below the knee. Swim trunks, jogging shorts, bike shorts, tennis shorts, baggy shorts below the knee and cut-offs are prohibited.

(5)Shoes with metal spikes, big knobby sole shoes, flip-flops, and any similar type of shoes are prohibited.

The dress code applies whether you are a member or a guest and are out to watch, play, or use the driving range and any of the practice areas. If you have any questions regarding the dress code please do not hesitate to call the golf shop and ask. Staff would much rather do this than have to bring any infractions to someone's attention after they have arrived at the course.

On behalf of the pro shop staff, all our golfers, and their guests I would like to thank everyone in advance for their help in and compliance with our dress code.

Additionally, we have begun clinics on the last Saturday of the month. These clinics are free, and we are including free access to OnForm which will allow you to view a voiceover video analysis of your swing at no cost. Swimmer's itch

Swimmer's itch is caused by the larval stage of a group of flatworm parasites. These parasites use both freshwater snails and vertebrates, like ducks, as hosts in their parasitic life cycles.

Humans usually become infected after swimming in lakes or other bodies of slow-moving fresh water. Children may become infected more frequently and more intensely than adults but this probably reflects their tendency to swim for longer periods.

It is a short-term reaction occurring in the skin of humans that have been infected by water-borne parasite. Symptoms, which include itchy, raised papules, commonly occur within hours of infection and do not generally last more than a week. It is common in freshwater, brackish and marine habitats worldwide.

There are no permanent effects to people from this condition. An orally administered antihistamine, is sometimes prescribed to treat swimmer's itch. In addition, bathing in oatmeal, baking soda, or Epsom salts can also provide relief of symptoms.

Life-cycle of swimmers itch



Once an egg is immersed in water, a short-lived, non-feeding, free-living stage emerges. This stage uses cilia to follow chemical and physical cues thought to increase its chances of finding the first intermediate host in its life cycle, a freshwater snail.

After infecting a snail, it develops into cyst that produces another short-lived, free-living stage, the cercaria.

Cercariae use a tail-like appendage (often forked in genera causing swimmer's itch) to swim to the surface of the water, and use various physical and chemical cue in order to locate the next and final (definitive) host in the life cycle, a bird. These larvae can accidentally come into contact with the skin of a swimmer. The cercaria penetrates the skin and dies in the skin immediately. The cercariae cannot infect humans, but they cause an inflammatory immune reaction. This reaction causes initially mildly itchy spots on the skin. Within hours, these spots become raised papules which are intensely itchy. Each papule corresponds to the penetration site of a single parasite.

After locating a bird, the parasite penetrates through the skin (usually the feet), dropping the forked tail in the process. Inside the circulatory system, the immature worms develop into mature male and female worms, mate and migrate through the host's circulatory system, or nervous system, to the final location within the host body. There they lay eggs in the small veins in the intestines from which they make their way into the gut, and are dumped into the water when the bird defecates, thus completing the life cycle.

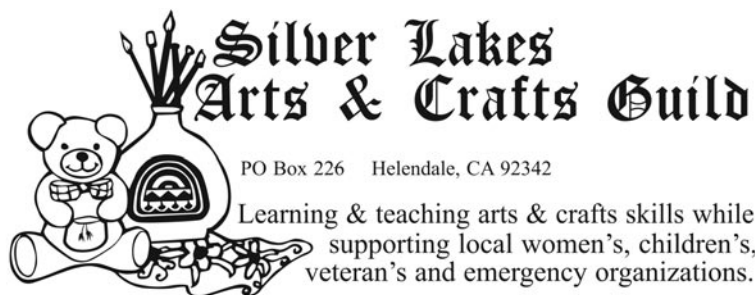

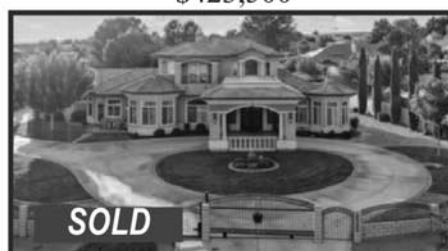

TRANSITION

As summer approaches, the transition from Ryegrass to Bermudagrass will be similar to years past as we anticipate the golf course will be overseeded this fall. After record temperatures during 2024 led to a strong resurgence in Bermudagrass we believe we will see continued strength this summer. However, we will continue promoting both turf types and allowing the Ryegrass to thrive in heavily shaded areas of the golf course. In this dual variety approach the cool season Ryegrass will perform well in the heavy shade areas and the Bermudagrass will perform well in the open, sunny areas.

Bermudagrass needs 120 days of optimal growing conditions to remain healthy and produce energy it needs to survive the winter. To achieve this, we go through transition, which is the process of promoting the growth and health of the Bermudagrass base while reducing competition from the winter Ryegrass.

Transition can be achieved through several different procedures. One procedure is the use of chemicals which will gradually kill the cool season Ryegrass. These chemicals usually take between three and six weeks to remove all of the cool season grass. The benefit of this procedure is it allows for the complete elimination of the Ryegrass allowing for no competition. Unfortunately, this process will also expose and highlight any areas with thin or no Bermudagrass.

Another procedure, which is more conservative, is to gradually transition through maintenance practices such as: reducing mowing heights, reducing irrigation inputs, aerification, growth regulators and fertilizer applications. This option is ideal for maintaining desired playing conditions.

Lowering of mowing heights combined with a growth regulator application will start in mid-March and continue until May. By gradually lowering mowing heights and regulating the spring growth, we allow more sunlight to reach the soil and the emerging Bermudagrass leaves without compromising playability. This allows soil temperatures to rise and the Bermudagrass to start producing food. Reducing irrigation inputs will cause the Ryegrass to gradually thin further allowing the sunlight to warm the soil and feed the Bermuda. Aerification will continue the process of slowly removing the Ryegrass and promote the growth and health as well. Fertilizer applications after aeration and throughout the summer will further promote the growth and health of our Bermudagrass base. Lastly, a spring application of turf pigment will help retain some heat in the plant resulting in a faster green-up of Bermudagrass in the Spring. The benefits to this process is the transition is slow with little disruption to course conditions. If there are areas where the bermudagrass base is thin, the Ryegrass will hopefully hold on and maintain turf coverage while we nurture the Bermudagrass into summer conditions.

As always, we hope to see you out on the course!

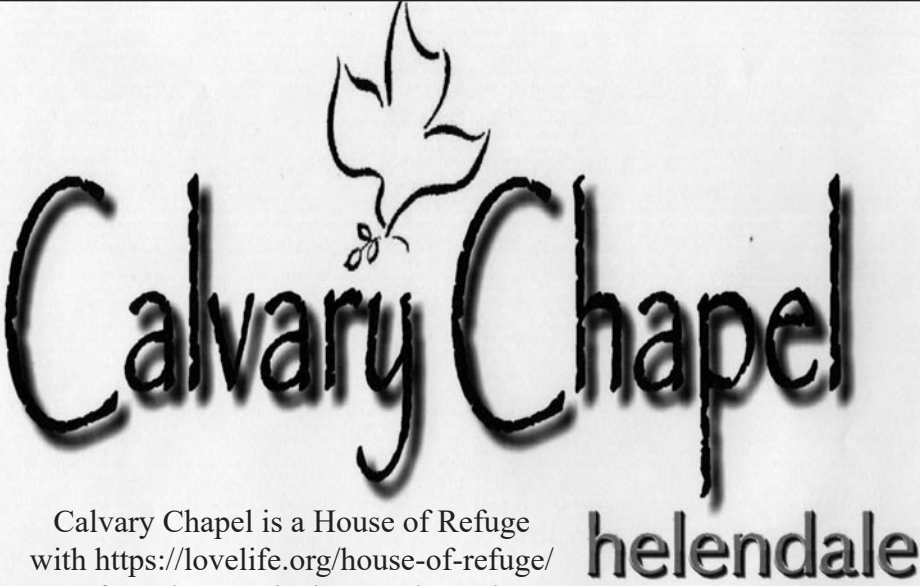
