CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

The LAC (Lakes Advisory Committee) under tutelage of Chair Lee Yaegle met about two weeks ago, Captain, Phil Harris and First Mate, Paul Tracey, met at North Lake.

The purpose was to check the buoys and the surrounding lake perimeter. The main buoy is grounded to the lake bottom. There is a direct line down from the white buoy to the bottom. The yellow buoy, "face buoy" connects to the white buoy. This is anchored a few feet under by a large cement can. The individuals that check the solar light for function and replace bird repellents.

Next, checking the stainless-steel connectors in preparation for boat hook-ups. This all in preparation for your Spring and Summer boating fun.

Next, was rounding each finger checking for cleanliness, maintenance/function and plant growth control.

Last leg, checking the lake collars for consistency and connectivity structure function.

It is a great boat ride, learning experience, and pleasant group collegiality. We would encourage voluntarism the next call to serve and get a free "boat ride".

Bring On the Heat!

As summer begins and temperatures start to climb all of the turf on the course is active. The Bermuda is waking with the help of cultural practices along with some early season warm temperatures, and the Poa and Rye are thriving with the cool mornings. As one might guess, water usage goes up during the summer to keep these grasses happy. From a play ability standpoint, this means softer playing conditions especially first thing in the morning after the irrigation cycles run during the night. It also means that your maintenance team will need to be out on the course in the afternoon "spot-watering" and using stationary sprinklers. Please bear with us while we spot-water during your round.

After a scheduled year off from overseeding and a surge in the Bermudagrass with last summer's heat, we have a better than normal stand of Bermudagrass heading into this summer. With a complete overseed on the schedule for this year, we will continue to promote the Bermudagrass throughout the summer in order to maximize our base to seed into. This will mean lower heights of cut, the use of growth regulators and wetting agents as we continue to focus on water management and cultural practices to allow the Bermudagrass to thrive. One of the cultural practices we will use is a tool called a Verti-Quake which has long knives that enter the soil and fracture beneath the turf to allow for increased water infiltration and pore space while leaving the surface with minimal disruption.

Although we will promote our Bermudagrass base, there will still be areas where the cool season Ryegrass will thrive (primarily in heavy shade areas). In these areas we will continue to promote the Ryegrass throughout the summer in order to provide the best playing conditions as possible.

We look forward to seeing you out on the course!

READY OR GNAT HERE THEY COME

The warmer weather triggers the bustling swarms of flying insects. Although they resemble mosquitoes and gnats, these winged creatures are, in fact, midges—a constant presence in our lakes during the late spring and early summer. Their life cycle begins with egg-laying in our lakes, giving rise to larvae known as “blood-worms,” which play a crucial role in consuming organic debris and algae. Transitioning through the pupa stage, they ascend to the water’s surface, emerging as the flying adults now ubiquitous in our town. The good news is that most midge species do not bite humans or animals.

As we find ourselves

amidst the peak season, it’s heartening to know that their numbers should gradually dwindle as the hotter months approach. However, during their short but active presence, they can be a nuisance, especially near porch lights or during evening strolls along the lake. While harmless, their sheer numbers can be overwhelming, often coating windows, cars, and outdoor furniture.

Unfortunately, midges constitute an inevitable facet of life in a desert community adjacent to bodies of water. Chemical insecticides have been tried in years past, but their minimal effectiveness is far outweighed by the damage to the ecology of the lakes. Midges are an important food source for birds, bats, and lizards. Dragonflies and other

predatory insects also help keep the adult midge population in check. Fish play a vital role too, especially during the larval and pupal stages. This underscores the significance of practicing catch and release in our lakes—a practice that promotes ecological balance while mitigat-

ing the midge population and sustaining our fishery. Speaking of which, our committee with the support of the board and volunteers have stocked additional bluegill sunfish in both lakes. The goal is to have them reproduce and create a renewable food source for our trophy bass and also serve as a vital part of our ecology and helping to reduce the population of our waterborne insects.

Residents can also help by reducing sources of nutrient runoff into the lakes, which can con-

tribute to algae blooms and boost the food supply for midge larvae. Being mindful of fertilizer use and cleaning up pet waste contribute to a healthier ecosystem—and fewer midges.

Spring weather has finally arrived!! The condition of the course has a lot to do with how our golfers treat it while using it. Please make sure that you are using cart paths where available. Carts also should not be driven within 30 feet of greens as well as bunkers. Now, more than ever, it is also important that you fill your divots, rake bunkers, and fix ball marks on the greens. Please, please, please observe and obey these common rules of golf and help maintain our wonderful amenity.

Additionally, players are still required to check in a minimum of 15 minutes prior to their tee time or you may have to forfeit it. As play picks up and the course gets busier this is very important. On tournament days please be considerate of golf shop staff and other golfers by making it to the course a minimum of 30 minutes before your tee time. Give yourself some time to enjoy an item from the snack bar or roll a few putts, or even hit a warmup bucket of balls-your golf score will reflect this and your time spent on the course will be that much more enjoyable.

It is unfortunate but I need to remind everyone that range balls and baskets are the property of the association and tak-

ing them away from the driving range is a violation of the rules and regulations. We recently replenished the range with new balls and baskets are already missing many of the balls. Please only purchase what you need to hit and leave unhit balls and baskets on the range or better yet return them to the golf shop.

As we move into the warmer weather, it is extremely important for everyone to follow the dress code. This means no blue jeans, no tee shirts, no short shorts, no spaghetti straps, no flip flops, etc... If you're not familiar with our dress code, feel free to stop in the golf shop and ask.

Swimmer's itch

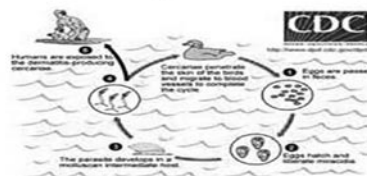
Swimmer's itch is caused by the larval stage of a group of flatworm parasites. These parasites use both freshwater snails and vertebrates, like ducks, as hosts in their parasitic life cycles.

Humans usually become infected after swimming in lakes or other bodies of slow-moving fresh water. Children may become infected more frequently and more intensely than adults but this probably reflects their tendency to swim for longer periods.

It is a short-term reaction occurring in the skin of humans that have been infected by water-borne parasite. Symptoms, which include itchy, raised papules, commonly occur within hours of infection and do not generally last more than a week. It is common in freshwater, brackish and marine habitats worldwide.

There are no permanent effects to people from this condition. An orally administered antihistamine, is sometimes prescribed to treat swimmer's itch. In addition, bathing in oatmeal, baking soda, or Epsom salts can also provide relief of symptoms.

Life-cycle of swimmers itch



Once an egg is immersed in water, a short-lived, non-feeding, free-living stage emerges. This stage uses cilia to follow chemical and physical cues thought to increase its chances of finding the first intermediate host in its life cycle, a freshwater snail.

After infecting a snail, it develops into cyst that produces another short-lived, free-living stage, the cercaria.

Cercariae use a tail-like appendage (often forked in genera causing swimmer's itch) to swim to the surface of the water, and use various physical and chemical cue in order to locate the next and final (definitive) host in the life cycle, a bird. These larvae can accidentally come into contact with the skin of a swimmer. The cercaria penetrates the skin and dies in the skin immediately. The cercariae cannot infect humans, but they cause an inflammatory immune reaction. This reaction causes initially mildly itchy spots on the skin. Within hours, these spots become raised papules which are intensely itchy. Each papule corresponds to the penetration site of a single parasite.

After locating a bird, the parasite penetrates through the skin (usually the feet), dropping the forked tail in the process. Inside the circulatory system, the immature worms develop into mature male and female worms, mate and migrate through the host's circulatory system, or nervous system, to the final location within the host body. There they lay eggs in the small veins in the intestines from which they make their way into the gut, and are dumped into the water when the bird defecates, thus completing the life cycle.
