CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

Summer Playing Conditions

With summer in full swing and temperatures into the 100s our cool season grasses are holding on in shade areas while the bermudagrass is awake and growing in the sunny ones. By forgoing an overseed in 2024, the bermudagrass will be stronger and more evident in the sunny areas. In order to push the bermudagrass, Wayne and the team have been applying fertilizers, soil amendments and adjuvants.

Leading up to overseed, we will continue to maintain the courses consistent to past years by trying to keep both cool season and warm season grasses happy and healthy. Some of those practices included utilizing wetting agents to help break surface tension and maintain moisture in the soil, the use of plant growth regulators to help reduce water demand, and the use of fungicides to help protect the Ryegrass and Poa from the stresses of heat, humidity, and increased water. We are also using a tool called a Verti-Quake which has long knives that enter the soil and fracture beneath the turf to allow for increase water infiltration and pore space while leaving the surface with minimal disruption. The combination of these practices gives us the best chance for retaining the cool season turf while still promoting bermudagrass through the summer in order to have a dense turf canopy throughout, but ultimately, we are at the mercy of Mother Nature.

As we move closer to our fall overseed, we continue to push the bermudagrass where possible in order to provide an excellent base for our overseed. As one might guess, water usage goes up during the summer to germinate new seed, push the existing bermudagrass and to keep the cool season ryegrass happy. From a playability standpoint, this means potentially softer playing conditions especially first thing in the morning after the irrigation cycles run during the night. It also means that your maintenance team will need to be out on the course in the afternoon "spot-watering" and using stationary sprinklers. Please bear with us while we spot-water during your round.

We look forward to seeing you out on the course!

Notice of Board Meeting and Board Vote to Approve Amended Rules and Regulations

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to Civil Code Section 4360, that the Board of Directors will be meeting to discuss and vote on publishing the proposed amendments to the Architectural Guidelines. A link to a copy of the proposed amended Architectural Guidelines is provided with this Notice.

There are many amendments proposed to the entire set of Architectural Guidelines. The specific amendments to each rule are indicated on the proposed guidelines, in redline. We urge you to review the proposed guidelines in detail.

The Board's purpose in amending the guidelines is to bring them into compliance with the updated Civil Code, update and clarify potential fines for certain violations, to resolve ambiguities with some existing rules, and to add clarity to other rules.

The Board invites your comments on the proposed amended Architectural Guidelines and will consider all comments received from homeowners prior to voting on the proposed amended guidelines at the Noticed Board meeting.

Swim with Less Itch This Summer

Summer is in full swing at Silver Lakes, and swimming is one of the best ways to cool off. However, you may have heard of — or experienced — swimmer's itch. Here's what to know and how to reduce your chances of being affected.

What Is Swimmer's Itch?

Swimmer's itch is a natural skin reaction caused by a parasite found in many freshwater lakes with ducks and snails. It's not a sign of dirty water. In fact, our lakes are known for their exceptional clarity thanks to constant circulation from our pumps.

The parasite's life cycle begins when waterfowl release eggs through their droppings. These hatch into larvae, which

infect snails. Once inside, they transform into a new stage called cercariae. These free-swimming forms then seek out birds—but if they come into contact with humans, they can cause a red, itchy rash.

Why Does It Affect Some More Than Others?

Like allergies, swimmer's itch affects people differently. Some may not react at all, while others develop itching, rashes, or even blisters. Cercariae are usually found near shorelines, especially where birds gather and snails are active. This is why shoreline treatments are sometimes applied—but

excessive chemical use can harm lake health, so treatments are targeted.

Don't Feed the Ducks: Reducing duck activity around swimming areas

Tips to Reduce Your Risk

Swim in Deeper Water: Avoid shallow areas where snails are more common.

Stay Clear of Muck: Cercariae often live in soft sediment at the lake bottom.

Use a Barrier Lotion: Waterproof sunscreen or oil-based products like baby oil can create a protective layer.

Rinse Off Quickly: Shower or towel off right after swimming to remove any parasites before they can enter your skin.

helps break the parasite cycle.

Support Catch-and-Release Fishing: Fish like redear sunfish (aka "shell crackers") eat snails and help naturally control their population. Consider using barbless hooks.

By taking these simple precautions, you can greatly reduce your risk and enjoy more time in the water.

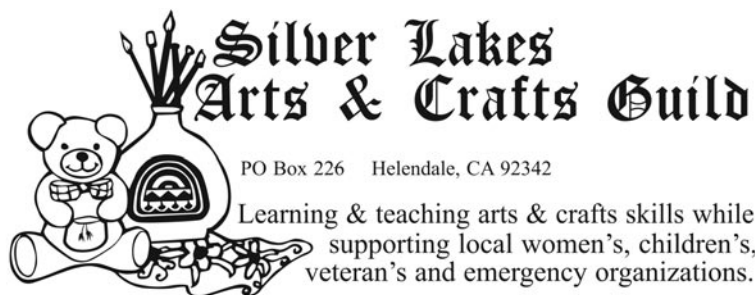

Swimmer's itch

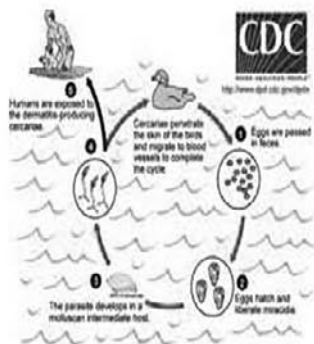
Swimmer's itch is caused by the larval stage of a group of flatworm parasites. These parasites use both freshwater snails and vertebrates, like ducks, as hosts in their parasitic life cycles.

Humans usually become infected after swimming in lakes or other bodies of slow-moving fresh water. Children may become infected more frequently and more intensely than adults but this probably reflects their tendency to swim for longer periods.

It is a short-term reaction occurring in the skin of humans that have been infected by water-borne parasite. Symptoms, which include itchy, raised papules, commonly occur within hours of infection and do not generally last more than a week. It is common in freshwater, brackish and marine habitats worldwide.

There are no permanent effects to people from this condition. An orally administered antihistamine, is sometimes prescribed to treat swimmer's itch. In addition, bathing in oatmeal, baking soda, or Epsom salts can also provide relief of symptoms.

Life-cycle of swimmers itch



Once an egg is immersed in water, a short-lived, non-feeding, free-living stage emerges. This stage uses cilia to follow chemical and physical cues thought to increase its chances of finding the first intermediate host in its life cycle, a freshwater snail.

After infecting a snail, it develops into cyst that produces another short-lived, free-living stage, the cercaria.

Cercariae use a tail-like appendage (often forked in genera causing swimmer's itch) to swim to the surface of the water, and use various physical and chemical cues in order to locate the next and final (definitive) host in the life cycle, a bird. These larvae can accidentally come into contact with the skin of a swimmer. The cercaria penetrates the skin and dies in the skin immediately. The cercariae cannot infect humans, but they cause an inflammatory immune reaction. This reaction causes initially mildly itchy spots on the skin. Within hours, these spots become raised papules which are intensely itchy. Each papule corresponds to the penetration site of a single parasite.

After locating a bird, the parasite penetrates through the skin (usually the feet), dropping the forked tail in the process. Inside the circulatory system, the immature worms develop into mature male and female worms, mate and migrate through the host's circulatory system, or nervous system, to the final location within the host body. There they lay eggs in the small veins in the intestines from which they make their way into the gut, and are dumped into the water when the bird defecates, thus completing the life cycle.
