Message from the Board

HAPPY NEW YEAR Silver Lakes! As you sweep up the confetti, toss those empty sparkling cider and champagne bottles out and generally de-holiday your home, it is also time to make those all-important New Year's resolutions.

One of those resolutions should be to make sure you VOTE in the upcoming Silver Lakes Association Board of Directors Election. You should have received your ballots and hopefully you attended our Meet the Candidates on the

6th of December. This year there are FOUR positions to fill, and we have ten candidates. Because of the number of candidates running, please make sure to turn the ballot over, because there will be choices on BOTH sides of the ballot. You are allowed a maximum of four votes PER property. You may cast your votes however you see fit, whether it be one vote for four different candidates or all four votes for one candidate, or any variation thereof up to the maximum of four. If you decide you do not want to vote for any candidate, please make sure you place your ballots in the envelope, seal it and SIGN the OUTSIDE envelope before mailing it back. Postage is FREE so there is no excuse not to return your ballots. Every ballot returned counts towards our quorum, even those empty ballots. If we do not meet quorum, we will have to hold a second election which will cost you the membership more money. If you did NOT receive your ballot, please contact the Silver Lakes Association Office and let

them know so they can get you another. You can still vote in person on Saturday February 7th. If we do not make quorum, it will be February 14th. Let's get our VOTE ON Silver Lakes and elect our Board the first go around!

Another important resolution is making your voice heard. As most of you are aware, BNSF has a massive railroad project underway which will impact on our ability to get in and out of Silver Lakes at the Vista railroad crossing. We are already seeing a substantial increase in not only the number of trains, but in the LENGTH of those trains as well. Sometimes the average wait is up to five minutes or more. This can mean life of death if one is waiting for an ambulance to get in or out of our community. An Environmental Impact Report was conducted and can be found on the Barstow website. Helendale was NOT considered as part of this study. Furthermore, we have only until JANUARY 5th to make a written response addressing our concerns. Please take

out your pen and paper and make your voice heard. We need to become that "SQUEAKY WHEEL" that will not go away so that those ELECTED County Officials hear us loud and clear. Another option is to get a convoy of members to attend the next County Board of Supervisors meeting and make sure they see we are committed to the safety and wellbeing of our community and its members!

Finally, we ask that you start attending the monthly Open Board meetings. These are held on the 4th Wednesday of each month and deal with many of the day-to-day issues involved in running an association of our size. Attendance gives you the opportunity to become informed about what is going on in our community, budgets and how your dues are being spent and other current issues. Be seen, be heard and become INVOLVED!

2026 here we come!

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

Winter Course Conditions

This year has seen another successful Ryegrass overseed on the Tees, Fairways, Green Surrounds and some Rough. Every overseed year there are some areas that do not germinate as well as others. This may be attributed to one of several factors, poor irrigation spacing leading to poor coverage, a lack of drainage in areas that remain excessively wet, salt accumulation in the soil and excessive compaction from cart traffic. We continually adjust sprinklers, use micro sprinklers and add seed and mulch mix to weak areas to help improve them. We will continue to have areas roped off to protect thin and newly seeded areas as well as high traffic areas to manage compaction.

Playing conditions throughout the Tees, Fairways and Green Surrounds are consistent with prior overseeds, however as you get farther into the rough you will notice a greater mix of dormant Bermudagrass with minimal Ryegrass. This has become more evident as the perimeter overseeding has shrunk over the past few years. The moving in of perimeter sprinkler heads will also lead to less holdover Ryegrass in the perimeter roughs.

As the cold winter temperatures linger, we will see a reduction in the ability to germinate seed as well as a slowdown in the growth of existing Ryegrass. This will persist until early spring when temperatures start to warm back up. As the temperatures start rising, we will see the cool season Ryegrass spring back to life and thrive.

Throughout the winter and early spring, we will continue to enhance the color and density of the overseeded Ryegrass through the use of foliar fertilizer applications and pigments. These pigments in conjunction with applications of fertilizer and iron help to absorb sunlight leading to an increase in color. This will not eliminate areas where the Bermudagrass has outcompeted the Ryegrass overseed, but it will help mask these areas creating a more uniform look.

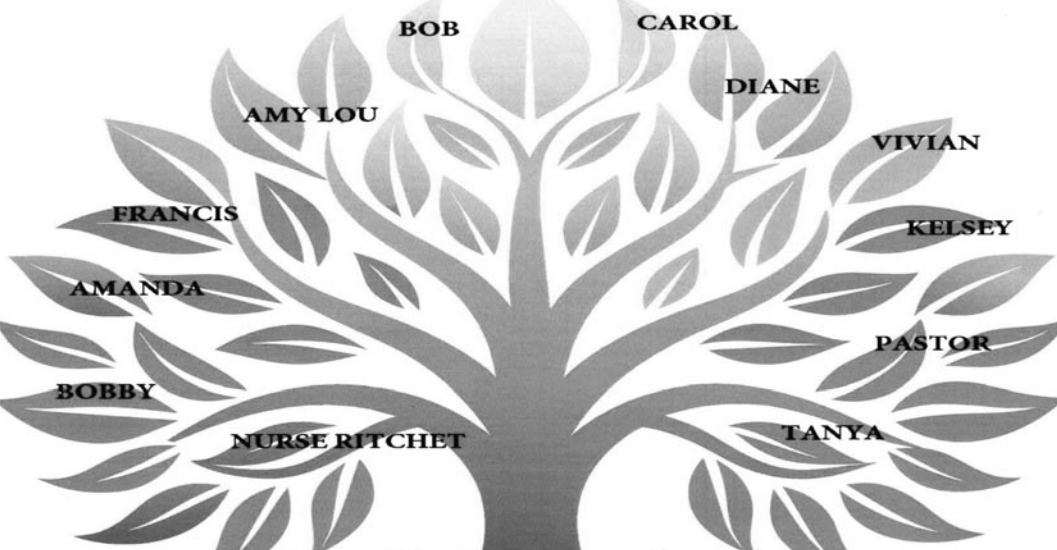

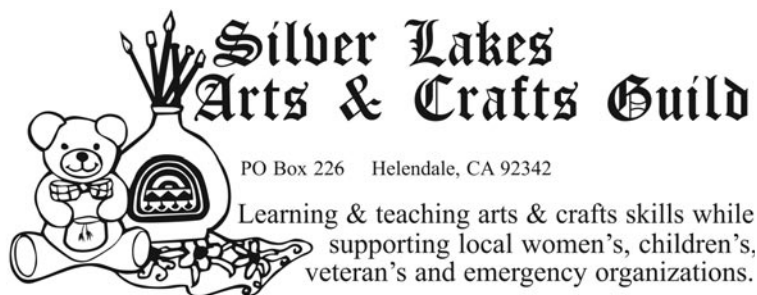

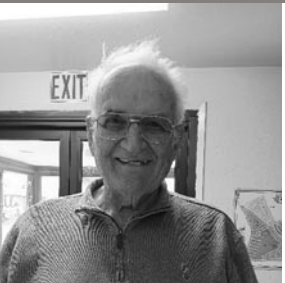
Lucas Lippold

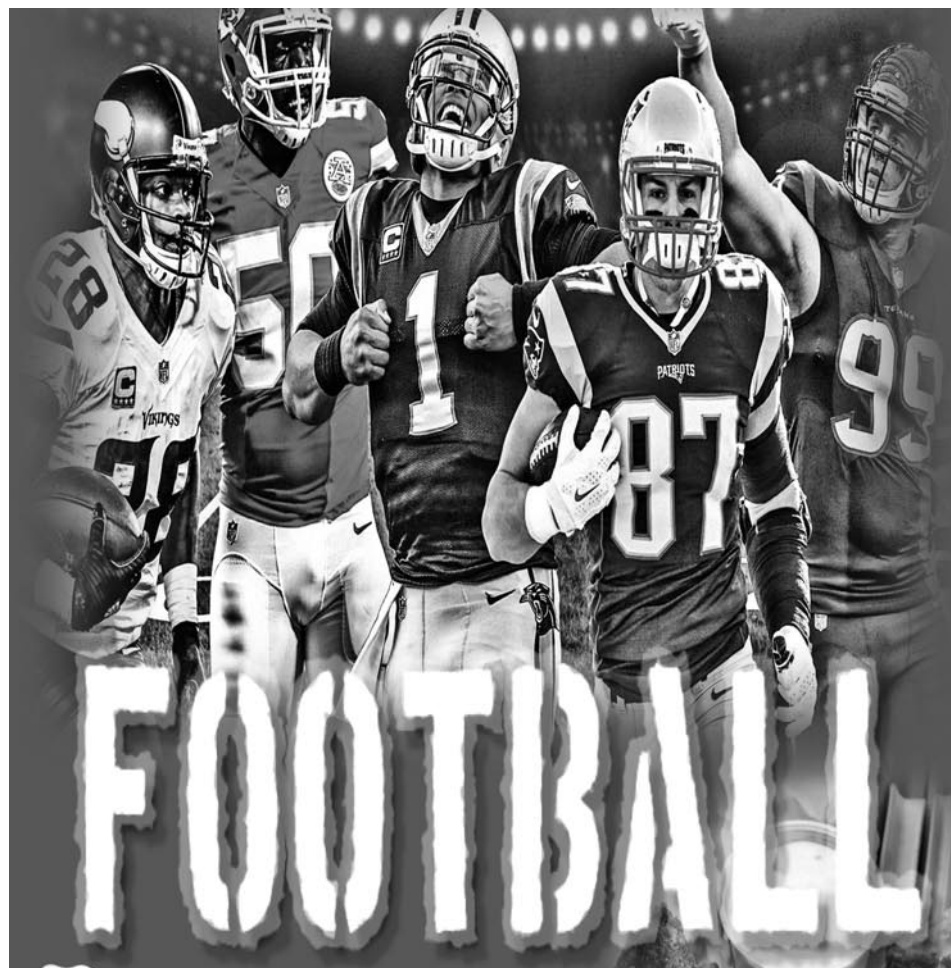

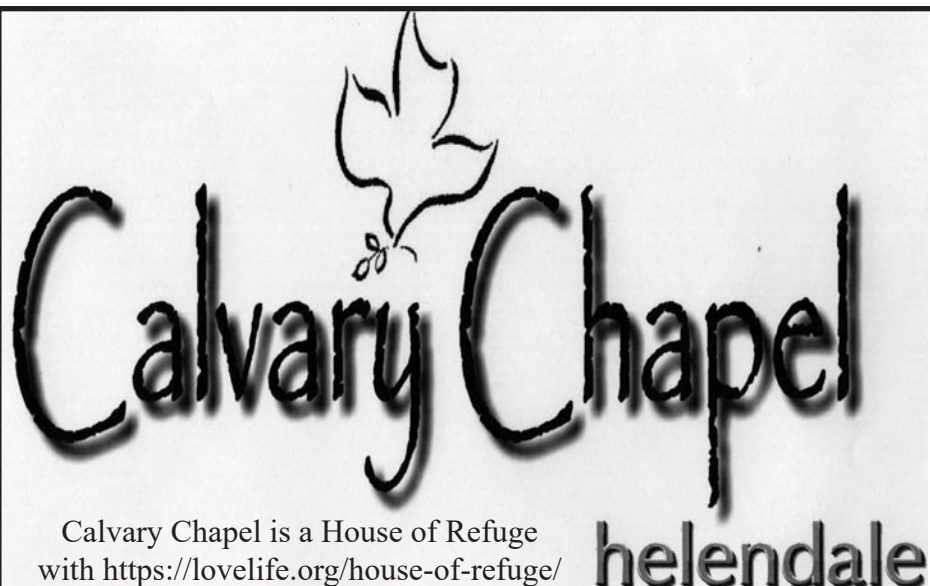
