Please read all information carefully. You may drop-off your ballot early at the SLA Admin Office during regular business hours, or in the drop box located at the clubhouse in the Recreation Room/Library.

For your ballot to be valid, the outside of the mailing envelope **MUST** be signed.

If mailing your ballot, it needs to be the Inspector of Elections by NOON on February 5, 2026.

PLEASE VOTE.....A QUORUM IS NEEDED.

Your Association will incur additional costs should a postponement until the following week more votes to reach quorum is needed!

Message from the Board

When this article is read, we should be in the final days of voting for the Silver Lakes Association Board of Directors. February 7th is the final day of voting, and all votes must be in possession of the voting company that does the official tallying. If vot-

ing on that day, ballots can be submitted to a voting box in the clubhouse and Pro shop by 10 am. Ballots can be turned in to a voting box on the previous Friday at the administration office. It is always best to use an outside agency to supervise these

types of things to guarantee there is no partiality. If you haven't already voted, please do.

There are ten people running for the board. That is a good sign of community members wanting to get involved to make Silver Lakes a better place to live. If you didn't already know, the board consists of seven Silver Lakes property owners. There are four open seats this year and next year there will be three open seats. Year after year it rotates between four open seats and three open seats.

Board members are expected to be in good standing in the community. They preside over an open board meeting on the fourth Wednesday on most months at 6 pm in the clubhouse library. The main ballroom may be used when expecting larger turnouts. This meeting is open to all property owners to witness. It is encouraged that you attend. It has been brought to the attention of the board that at the meetings there is no dialogue with those attending. At the beginning of the meeting, property owners are entitled to express

thoughts on any agenda item. It must not be more than three minutes. At the end of the meeting, members are again given three minutes to express their thoughts on pretty much anything. This is how most all government entities run their meetings. This meeting isn't an open-ended opportunity to dialogue with board members but rather an opportunity to witness the board business of the association. If community members want a dialogue about a concern, they should talk to board members individually or call the association and talk to the general manager.

Board members must also attend an executive meeting on the 2nd Wednesday of each month. These meetings are rather long and go over most issues of the association. Members who are late on their dues and members who were given a fine and want to contest usually start off these meetings. Budget expenditures are also discussed.

Board members need to take part in the numerous committees in the association. There is the Fines Committee, Environmental Control

Committee, Restaurant Committee, Greens Committee, Budget Committee, Lakes Committee, and Recreation Committee. Board members must also be accessible at a moment's notice for emergency meetings referencing personnel issues, emergency expenditures, or any emergency that might arise.

Lastly, the board actively looks at how the association might operate better. There is the selection of contractors, choosing new computer software, rewriting policies, changing job descriptions, and any host of other needed demands.

It is not an easy job. How many people are willing to donate five to fifteen hours per week, or more, of their time to make Silver Lakes a better place to live? Listening to your concerns in the community is the job of all prospective board members; that is the expectation. They obviously won't be able to please everyone. Some people revel in negativity but an occasional thank you to the future board would certainly go a long way in keeping good community members on the board.

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

Winter Projects Update

Oftentimes, we are asked... "What do you do during the winter while the grass isn't growing as much?" This is a very valid question because some of what we accomplish during the cooler months isn't flashy or as noticeable. However, the tasks are very important in the overall management of the course at all times of the year. This winter we have been experiencing warmer than normal temperatures in December which has led to the continued need for regular maintenance practices on the golf course. These warmer than expected temperatures have limited our availability to dedicate significant time to projects.

Last year, significant time was dedicated to remarking the golf course perimeter for the potential of an irrigation renovation and resizing of the golf course turf. This winter we have spend time making additional irrigation sprinkler shifts for better coverage of the perimeter turf lines.

We continue to work towards completion of the turf conversion project on 7 South tee complexes. The project is approximately 95% complete with a final delivery of hardscape materials scheduled for delivery in January. This material will be used to complete the tie-in near the condos and completion of the project. Upon completion of 7 South, we redirected our efforts to 6 North for the installation of hardscape materials.

This winter bunkers have been on our radar where we have been able to add and/or redistribute sand in bunkers throughout the golf course allowing for greater consistency.

We also spend significant time performing an annual cleanup and refresh of the already converted areas. This work included mechanical and chemical removal of weeds, edging turf and DG borders, trimming trees and bushes and reburying any irrigation lines that have been exposed over the past year. This is a routine process performed every winter allowing us to be ready for the spring growing season.

As always, we look forward to seeing you out on the course!
