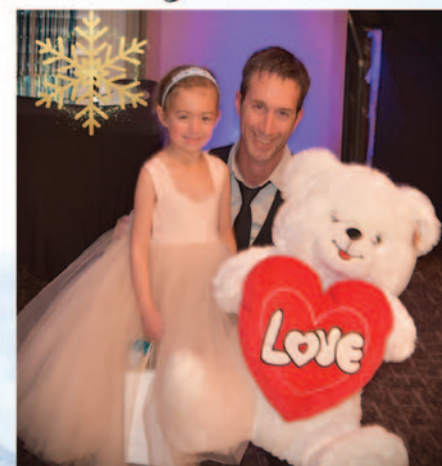
Daddy Daughter Dance 2026

Message from the Board

Hello Silver Lakes! Can you feel it, that hint of spring? March has arrived as well as an earlier than usual Daylight Savings Time change on the 8th. Do not forget to “Spring” forward your

clocks by one hour. Everyone gets an extra hour of daylight to experience Silver Lakes and all the wonderful amenities we have.

Our amenities are not

free. They are funded entirely by the homeowners through the monthly assessments we all pay. To ensure responsible stewardship of those funds, the Silver Lakes Board of Directors begins the budget process early each year. For the 2026/2027 fiscal year, that process commenced in February. It is a deliberate and time-intensive effort that requires hours of detailed review across every department that supports and sustains our community, including Administration, Maintenance, ECC, Restaurant and Snack Bar, Golf Course and Pro Shop, Recreation, and the Equestrian Center. As part of this process, a Board of Directors subcommittee meets directly with each Department Manager to review operating expenses, evaluate financial performance, and identify opportunities to improve efficiency while remaining within budgetary con-

straints. The goal is not only to preserve the quality of our amenities, but to do so in a fiscally responsible manner that respects the financial investment made by every homeowner.

Reviews of those departmental budgets are only the beginning of the process. We must also review our extensive Reserve Study to determine which projects we have still open currently as well as those we have identified as necessary in the upcoming year. Those expenses then determine the reserve portion of our assessment.

Contract reviews are also conducted, our Budget and Finance Committee has been working hard to keep an eye on day-to-day expenditures, and we are very thankful for their hard work and diligence.

Much is said about transparency! The Board of Directors has ALWAYS taken steps to ensure that

you as the homeowner are provided with a LINE-by-LINE account of where your hard-earned dollars are going! This year is different. The Board of Directors approved to have a meeting conducted on a Saturday to hopefully get more attendance

Here are the dates of those Special Open meetings: April 1st at 5 pm in the Clubhouse Library. The second meeting will be held on SATURDAY April 11th at 1 pm in the Clubhouse Library. CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Silver Lakes Association diligently monitors compliance with the Governing Documents to preserve the value of the Community for every resident. The Association, through its Board of Directors is obligated to enforce the Association covenants, Rules and Regulations in a fair, consistent and equitable manner. We monitor use and operation of recreation facilities and Common Areas to ensure that all residents are in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding the use and enjoyment of these facilities. Our goal is to encourage every resident to understand the Community rules and standards and to comply, voluntarily, so that the Association is not forced to compel compliance or issue fines for violations. In addition, consistent, diligent code enforcement, and monitoring the activities of Silver Lakes residents serves as a deterrent to crime and criminal activity.

Notwithstanding the Association's code enforcement efforts, the Association can never be completely crime free. It is therefore the responsibility of every Silver Lakes resident to take whatever steps they deem necessary to safeguard and protect themselves, and their property. The Association will continue to disclose any information regarding crime, criminal activity or community safety; however, residents cannot and should not rely upon the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Residents must safeguard their own property with such precautions as keeping doors locked; requesting identification from contractors or service providers; installing a security system; carrying insurance; etc.

The Association's Code Enforcement personnel are responsible for patrolling ONLY the Association Common Areas, various Association properties and facilities, and to observe and report on service calls, suspicious activities or violations of the Association's Rules and Regulations, where applicable.

The Silver Lakes Association does not provide, and has never offered or provided security services to members and/or their properties. Code Enforcement will come out as a courtesy if there is a need to observe or take a report. Code Enforcement will also assist first responders should their services be requested. However, if a situation warrants it, residents are advised to call the Sheriff and/or California Highway Patrol.

Right to Receive General Notice by Individual Delivery Civil Code §§5310(a)(4), 4045(b)

All members have the option to receive general notices by individual delivery, instead of by General Delivery. A request for individual delivery of general notices to the Member, that would otherwise be posted in the common area, on the website, or made by some form of general notice, or a request to cancel a prior request for individual delivery of general notices. This request must be in writing. Any electronic record satisfies the "in writing" requirement, as long as it comes in a form that can be retained, electronically or printed.

AERIFICATION

As the spring growing season approaches, it is time to start thinking about the annual implementation of cultural practices, specifically fairway aerification.

Aeration is important as it allows for management of organic matter in the soil, relieves soil compaction, stimulates root growth, releases toxic gases from the soil, improves water infiltration, improves drainage, allows for amendments to incorporate into the soil, and improves turfgrass response to fertilizers. It is usually performed during periods of growth ranging from early spring through fall.

Here at Silver Lakes Country Club, we replaced our aerifier with a state-of-the-art aerifier from Toro for use on the fairways as part of our salt mitigation program. With a coring width of 98 inches, the Toro 1298 allows us to aerify more than an acre per hour while producing a clean aerification hole. By utilizing this aerifier, we are able to obtain hole spacing anywhere from 2" to 4.5". This allows us to effectively break up of compacted soil and incorporate amendments into the soil. This process allows for increased water penetration, increased pore space for roots, increased movement of water and air in the soil, and enables salts to be moved (leached) below the root zone. All of these benefit the turf health and the playing conditions at Silver Lakes Country Club while limiting the closure time.
